Special Business Training For Deaf Launched at RBI

A school to provide business training for the deaf, believed to be the first of its kind in the country, is being established by Rochester Business Institute, 172 Clinton Ave. South.

The new department of the institute is the outgrowth of success experienced by the Institute in giving hand-tapped individual a specialized business training.

Actual organization of the school has been brought about through the interest of Mrs. Margaret G. Lee of Rochester, mother of a deaf girl who has spent the past 12 years in efforts to find schools prepared to offer specialized training for the deaf and in experimental work aimed at a solution of the handicap.

In an effort to find ways to help the deaf achieve normal speech she took part in pioneer research with osteopaths and vibratory mechanicians producing satisfactory results in the laboratories of the University of Rochester. Psychology Department. This work will be carried on by the Rochester Telephone Company's laboratories.

Mrs. Lee said she will serve as extension school points out that teachers of the deaf are not specially trained to impart ideas and that deafness through oral pronunciation is a great handicap. A phonetic alphabet is in use.

Her failure to find a school in the country offering an extended business training for the deaf led her to collaborate with Rochester Business Institute in offering a special curriculum. Her efforts she says reveals that many states lack even training for the deaf at high school level.
