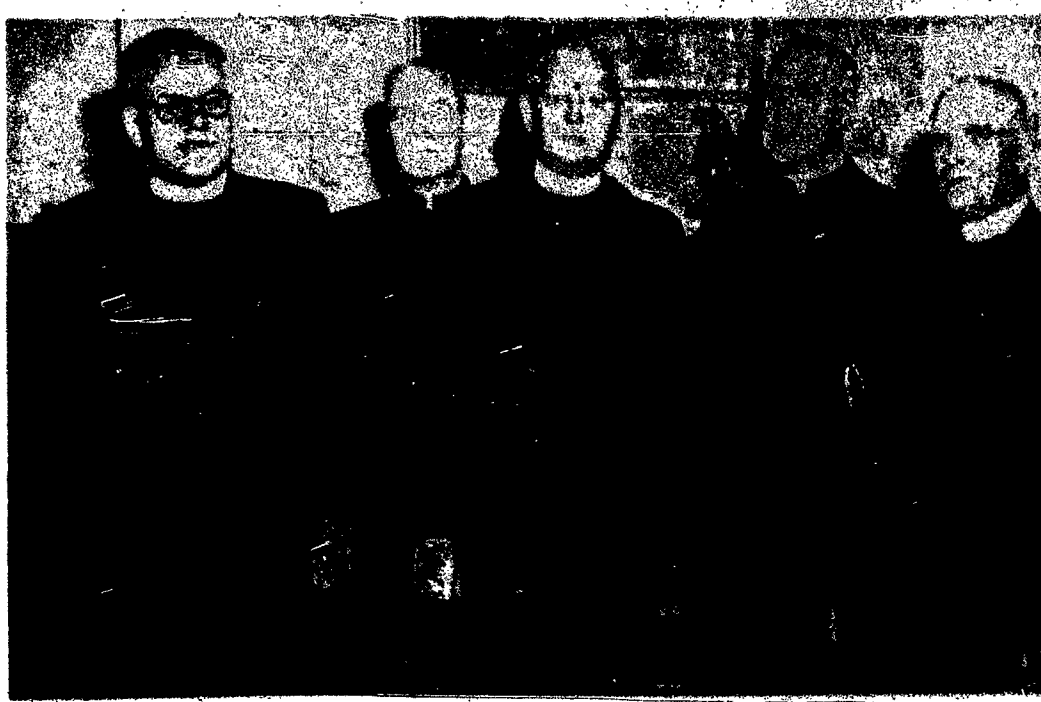

IN THE 25 years of his pastorate Father Jerome has devoted himself not only to his spiritual duties as pastor, but he has proved to be a capable and efficient administrator.

Monument Honoring Sisters Erected By Alhambra Order

In the presence of several hundred religious of the Congregation de Notre Dame, a monument was unveiled in Montreal to the memory of the Blessed Marguerite Bourgeoise.

Nearly 2,000 members of the fraternal organization, most of them from the United States, gathered in Montreal, sporting their white fezzes for their 24th reunion. The Alhambra has two aims, to make members better known to each other and to conserve Catholic historical sites.

JOSEPH M. MCKENNA, of Washington, D. C., was elected Supreme Commander of the order at the closing session. He succeeds Norman A. O'Brien, of Rochester, N. Y.

O'Brien after completing two successful years in office was presented with a handsome Alhambra ring. He was accompanied to the convention by Grand Commander Rocco F. Natale of Musa Caravan, and a large delegation from Rochester.

THE GREY STONE monument was unveiled by retiring Supreme Commander O'Brien. It bears the inscription: "To the memory of Marguerite Bourgeoise, 1629-1700, founder of the Congregation de Notre Dame and is the work of the sculptor J. Brunet.

Magr C. A. Labelle, chaplain of the Eudes Caravan of Montreal, said a better subject could not have been chosen for this tribute by the order. The Congregation de Notre Dame, from its humble beginnings in Ville Marie, has spread out until today it has many houses in Canada, the United States and elsewhere.
