Augustinian Father Marks 25 Years In Priesthood

Very Rev. Clement C. McHale, O.S.A. of Chicago, whose mother, Mrs. Judith McHale resides at 386 Hazelwood Terrace, celebrated the silver jubilee of his ordination to the Holy Priesthood on Sunday, September 2 at St. Ambrose Church, Rochester.

At the same time his brother, Urban McHale and Mrs. McHale, of 150 Ridgeway Ave. celebrated their 20th wedding anniversary. Also present were Father McHale's two sisters, Mrs. John Ryan and Mrs. Renard Brown.

ASSISTING THE jubilarian in a Solemn High Mass of Thanksgiving were the Rev. John J. Fitzmaurice, O.S.A., deacon and the Rev. John McCall, subdeacon, both of Lawrence, Mass. Also in the Sanctuary were the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Charles H. Shay and the Rev. William Doyle, O.S.A., of Chicago.

Tribute to the Augustinian Father's 25 years of zealous priestly service was paid by the Rev. Frank W. Mason, pastor of St. Ambrose Church in the sermon.

Father McHale is the Provincial of the Mother of Good Counsel Province of the Augustinian Fathers with headquarters in Chicago. He served in the Pacific during World War 2 as a chaplain and was separated from the service with the rank of Lieutenant Commander.

He is a native of Pittston, Pa. where he attended St. Mary's Grammar School. His mother and others of the family came to Rochester about 15 years ago.

THE JUBILARIAN went to Villanova Preparatory School and in November, 1919 entered the novitiate of the Augustinian Fathers. He was graduated from Villanova College in 1923 and made his philosophy and theological studies at St. Mary's Hall. He was ordained by the late Cardinal Dougherty at Villanova College on August 29, 1926.

He went to the Catholic University for advanced studies until 1927 when he was assigned to teach at Cascia Hall, Tulsa, Oklahoma. In 1935 he was assigned to St. Rita's High School.
