National, State Verein Groups Elect Gervais

A Rochester man was chosen for office at both the national convention of the Catholic Central Verein of America in Pittsburgh and the state branch sessions in Troy on Thursday, Sept. 29 at 9 a.m.

Joseph H. Gervais, Rochester attorney of 108 Aldine St. was elected a national director at the 96th convention of the Catholic Central Verein meeting in Pittsburgh and at the state branch convention over the Labor Day weekend in Troy. He was named recording secretary of the state organization.

Enlightened statesmanship and revitalization of the West's moral and religious forces are necessary if the challenge of communism is to be met, the Catholic Central Verein of America declared in a resolution adopted at its 96th convention in Pittsburgh.

This was in the days of rugged individualism when many Catholics, imbued with the spirit of liberalism, were inclined to believe that the existing order and American conditions in general were beyond all criticism, he said. Mr. Gervais added that "it was many years before any other Catholic societies and organizations" followed the Central Verein's example.

IN A RESOLUTION on drug addiction among youth the Central Verein said:

"Penal laws and police action, while good in themselves, cannot solve this problem. Almighty God, and His natural and divine law, must reign in the homes and schools of our nation before this tragic evil can be eradicated."

Delegates to the 50th annual meeting of the Catholic Verein's New York State Branch and the 2nd annual convention of the Catholic Women's Union state group met at the Hendrick Hudson Hotel in Troy.

Edward J. Jensen, state president of the Verein, noted where the code of morality is attacked in his annual message at the annual hall said.

"DO NOT HIDE your light under a bushel—but radiate your Catholic teaching whenever the dignity and dignity of the church are infringed. In this way we are creating the Christian code of moral values and help in our society."

Deputy Ernest Kana, O.F.M., vice of the Verein and professor at Saint College, forecast that the Catholic Women's Union would win the next fifty years a worldwide effect. National president Sattler at the banquet said.
