### Remains of Father Faber Moved To London Church

London — (NC)—The remains of Father Frederick Faber, the popular hymn-writer of the nineteenth century, have been removed from a London suburban cemetery with special government permission and buried in the church of the Oratorian Fathers in the heart of the West End.

HE CAME OVER to the Church with Cardinal Newman in 1845 when Catholicism suddenly began to take roots again in this country after over 200 years of silence. In his first English country office house, the thirteenth-century house called the Wilfridians, or Brothers of the Will of Father Faber, who died 88 years ago, was brought back to life in Wilfrid, but later joined the Oratorians.

Intercession of Our Lady of Ransom.  
ANOTHER EXAMPLE of the Blessed Mother's special interest in China today, the Internuncio said, concerns the Legion of Mary, the organization which in his words will save the Faith in China if all the priests are forced to flee. Today is the 30th anniversary of the founding of the Legion of Mary in Dublin, and the Archbishop's support of the Legion is one of the three formal charges made against him in the expulsion order handed him by the Nanking police. (The other two charges are his opposition to the "independent church" program and his dealing with "traitors" to the Red state.)

The events of the last few days came as a surprise to Archbishop Ribert. The last public demonstration against him in Nanking was on July 25, when about 200 alleged Catholics marched past the legation.

THE CHURCH has already undergone one great test in China and it has won the battle, the Papal Internuncio said. He viewed that victory as almost miraculous. It was an escape from wholesale heresy six months ago when the communists were releasing rivers of propaganda for their "independent Catholic church" program, he related.

The Red campaign, he noted, caused great confusion among the faithful. We had no press or radio media to warn Catholics of the dangers. "Our printing press had been seized. Communications with our missions in the field were cut off. Our publications were banned from the mails."

After he issued a letter warning of the dangers of the "independent church" program, he stated, the Reds organized a rally where abusive placards were displayed and his "punishment" was demanded. From that time, Archbishop Ribert and his staff were subjected to numerous long interrogations at the police station. During these questionings he was seated on a small, backless stool and, in one case, was compelled to stand for a half-hour as a punishment.

The questionings became long and more severe as weeks passed, until last Tuesday night, when the Internuncio and the two members of his staff were

### Fisher Art Collection Given Notre Dame

Notre Dame, Ind. — (NC)—A collection of rare paintings and tapestries by old masters, valued at \$1,000,000, has been given to the University of Notre Dame by Mrs. J. Fisher, widow of the founder of the Fisher Body Company, Detroit. It was announced yesterday by the Rev. John J. Cavanaugh, C.S.C., President of Notre Dame.

The gift of valuable paintings marks the second large donation by Mrs. Fisher to Notre Dame in less than two years. It was announced in December, 1949, that Mrs. Fisher, whose late husband was a member of the Associate Board of Lay Trustees at Notre Dame, had given \$1,000,000 to the University for the erection of a new student residence hall and for a revolving student loan fund.

MRS. FISHER'S prize art collection, which will be housed in Notre Dame's Wightman Memorial Art Galleries, consists of seventeen paintings and three tapestries. The paintings range in price up to \$150,000, while the tapestries are valued at \$30,000. Four of the old paintings have been evaluated by art critics at \$10,000 or more each.

The most highly-prized of the gift paintings is "Portrait of a Woman," by Bart Vaneto. The other three most valuable paintings of the collection are another "Portrait of a Woman," by the Italian master, Antonio Pollaiuolo; "Anne, Lady Townsend," by George Romney, a noted English historical and portrait painter of the late eighteenth century; and "Le Bouton De Rose," by Francois Boucher, self-taught French artist of the eighteenth century, who is remembered as a famed historical genre painter.

TWO WORKS of Mrs. Elizabeth Vigee Lebrun, well known French painter of the eighteenth and early nineteenth centuries, who painted twenty paintings of Marie Antoinette, also are in the collection. These include "Portrait of Marquise Boudard de Saint-James, Marquise de Puysegur," and "Portrait of Henri Cabou Playing the Violin." Jean Marc Nattier, French painter who is remembered for his paintings of ladies of the court of Louis XV, is represented in the Notre Dame gift collection by two of his leading works: "Marquise de Torcy" and "Portrait of a Lady."

Four of the other originals are "Madonna and Child" by de Sanro; and "Marquis de Torcy" by Louis Tocque, eighteenth century artist who painted Empress Elisabeth.
