Mrs. Murphy declares: "The Catholic Daughters of America, the largest Catholic women's organization in the world, was formed in 1903 with a membership of 60 in Utah. It is now established in 36 states and in Panama, Puerto Rico, Hawaii, Cuba and Canada."

"AIM OF the members is the preservation of their religion, the material, moral and intellectual development of Catholic womanhood and the protection and well being of Catholic girls. It is pledged to the dispensation of charity and the furtherance of all worthwhile charitable and civic projects."

"There is no limitation placed on the scope of the Catholic Daughters. The national program includes religious education, the retreat movement, the Convent League, Catechetical Centers, Study Clubs, Social

Hope In Japanese Treaty Told Kiwanis

The peace treaty with Japan may well mark the dawn of an era, the Era of Hope, rooted in Justice, Miss Zaida Lyons, a member of the staff of St. John Fisher College in the Department of History, told the North-east Kiwanis members at their meeting, this week.

Miss Lyons who is also registrar and director of public relations at the college cited from the treaty: "The eternal values of justice and charity preside over the destiny of mankind. We've tried to live by opportune compromise... the plaintive cry of millions calls for principles."

Reflecting on the significance of the Japanese Peace Treaty and the San Francisco Conference, Miss Lyons noted that never before in modern times have victors in a great and bitter war applied the principle so evident in this agreement among Nations... the principle of reconciliation built on the premise that the principle of fairness, magnanimity and idealism are the best guarantees for mutual trust and understanding among nations and peoples.
