

St. Joseph Hospital Director of Nurses Appointed Dean

At a meeting of the Board of Directors of St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira, on Tuesday afternoon, Reverend Mother M. Helene, General Superior of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Rochester was appointed President of the Board. Sister Anne Maurice was named a new board member.

SISTER LEONA is being retained as a member of the Hospital Board of Directors. Sister will be succeeded at the hospital by Sister Anne Maurice, newly appointed Director of the School of Nursing. Sister is a graduate of St. Joseph's Hospital School of Nursing and has a Master of Science in Nursing Education, Catholic University of America, Washington, D.C.

Sister M. Florence, also a graduate of St. Joseph's Hospital School of Nursing and with a Master of Science in Nursing Education, Catholic University, will act as Assistant Director of Nurses.

Memberships Will Finance Monastery's New Building

Construction of the much needed addition to the Dominican Monastery of the Perpetual Rosary is rapidly progressing and it is expected to be ready for occupancy some time around the first of the year.

The present building consists of two stories and full finished basement. Inexpensive construction being erected adjacent to the present Monastery, made necessary in order to accommodate several young women who have expressed a desire to enter as postulants.

THE NEW ADDITION will be 30 feet wide by 90 feet long and will increase the capacity of the Monastery to 29 cells. It will have full facilities for storage rooms, boiler room, laundry, kitchen, community rooms and an infirmary.

The interior of the building will be of asphalt tile floors, glazed tile wainscoting, acoustical ceilings and steel stairways throughout the entire building.

The laymen's advisory committee met this week under the guidance of Chairman Harry J. Lagonegro and discussed plans to continue the efforts to enroll additional numbers in the Association of the Perpetual Rosary.

Renewal subscriptions for those now affiliated are due the first Sunday in October—Rosary Sunday. It is hoped that many additional subscriptions will be received as this is one of the chief means of obtaining funds to help defray the cost of the new building.

Subscriptions are \$2 for one year, \$4 for two years and \$10 for five years.

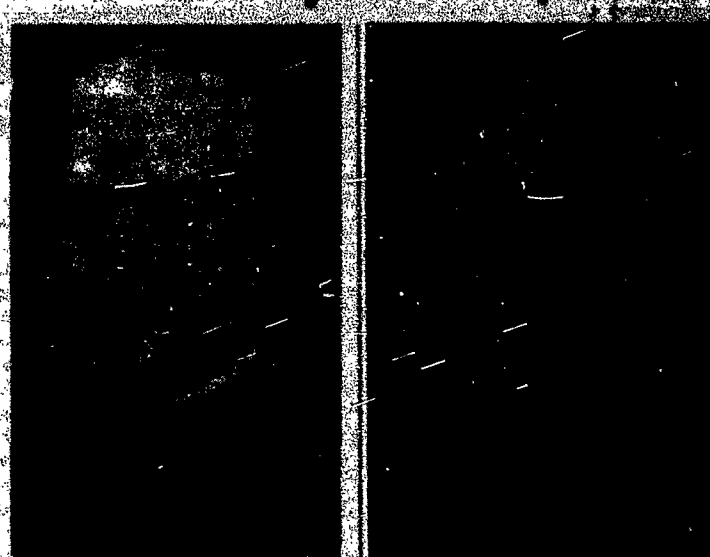
