Reports Catholic 326 Memberships Reported Killed In Korea In Lecture Forum Drive

Word was received this week that PFC. Marvin C. Enright, a Catholic soldier, 28, son of

Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Enright, 706 Linden Street, was killed in action in Korea August 28, 1951.

The soldier enlisted in the Army for three years Dec. 29, 1950. In May he was shipped to Korea. He fought with the 9th Infantry Regiment of the famed 2nd Division. In the last letter received by his parents he said he expected to be home for Christmas. Prior to his enlistment he was employed at the Star Market on Dewey Ave. and then by a roofing contractor.

Pvt. Charles Mura Wounded In Korea

Pvt. Charles E. Mura was wounded in action in Korea according to word received by his wife who lives at 1365 Goodman St. N. and his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Charles E. Mura, 160 Weaver St. According to his letter the soldier expected to be in the field hospital about nine days for wounds resulting from an exploding grenade. He was wounded August 31.



Private Mura was employed by Baugh and Lomb Optical Company before being inducted into the Army last February. After training at Fort Dix, N. J., he was married during a seven day furlough in June. He landed in Korea August 1 and was assigned to the Second Division.

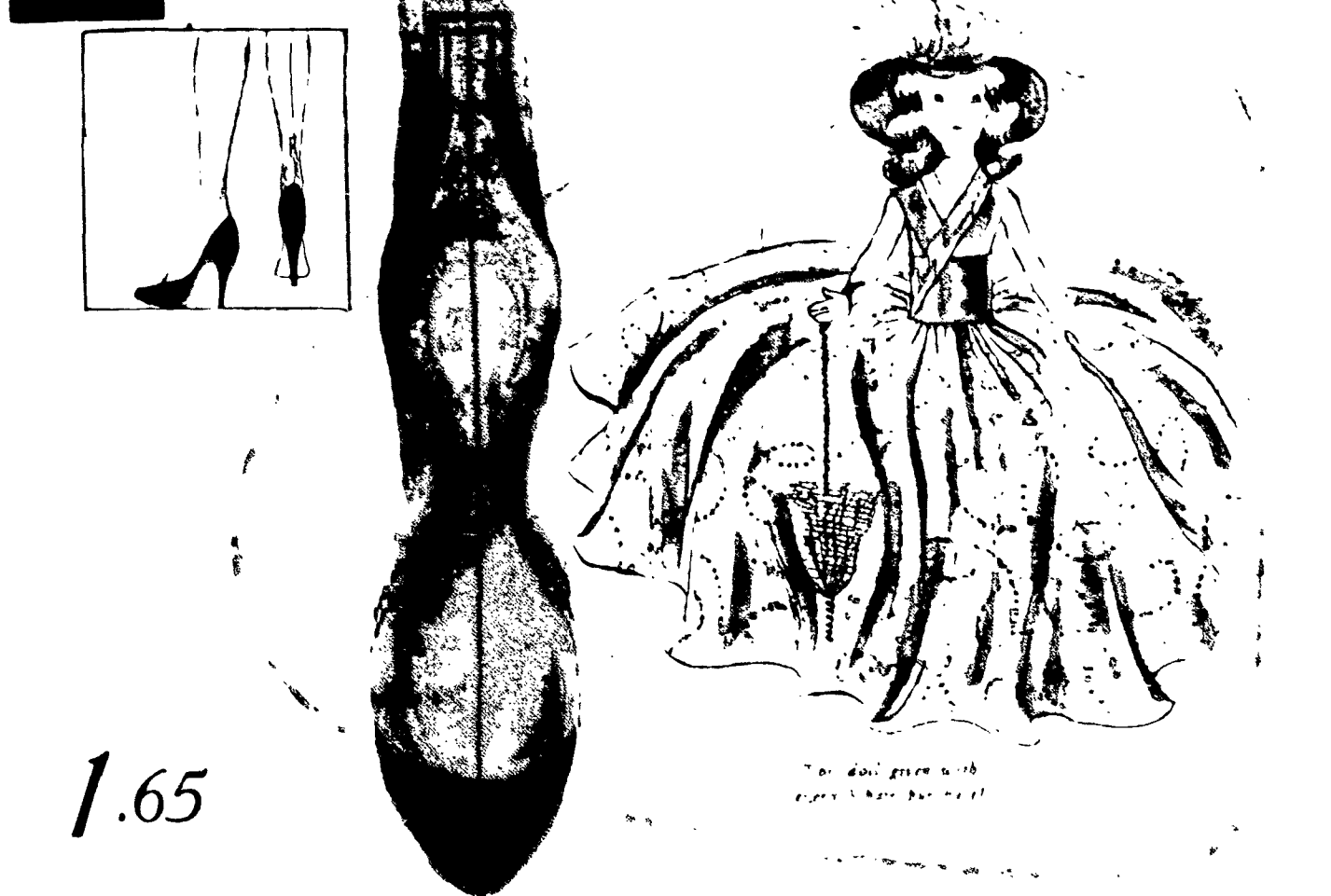
