

Hospitality House Named DCCW 'War Relief Depot'

St. Joseph's House of Hospitality, three-story brick building at 102 South Ave., will serve as the new "War Relief Depot" for the Diocesan Council of Catholic Women.

The announcement was made this week by the Rev. John T. Callahan, assistant pastor of St. Augustine's Church and DCCW moderator, who said that arrangements were completed with the board of directors of the Hospitality House.

SELECTION OF a new collection and packaging depot was necessitated, Father Callahan explained, by conversion of the present depot, the former Our Lady of Victory School, into the new School of the Holy Childhood. The House of Hospitality, the priest noted, will be convenient because it is open day and night.

For several years the DCCW has cooperated with the National Catholic Welfare Conference War Relief Services in supplying clothing for "The Pope's Storehouse" for the needy in European nations.

Fr. Meade Heard At Teachers' Meet

While the nation has slipped into the murky valley of pragmatism, says the signing of the Declaration of Independence, and we have lost as a nation officially, belief in God and man's eternal God-given rights, he said, it does not signify all is lost.

"Our duty," said Father Meade is to get a fire in the young people of today, an enlightened courage to defend what our forefathers called the certain unalienable rights just as our brother and sisters in the Faith are defending them today behind the Curtain called Iron.
