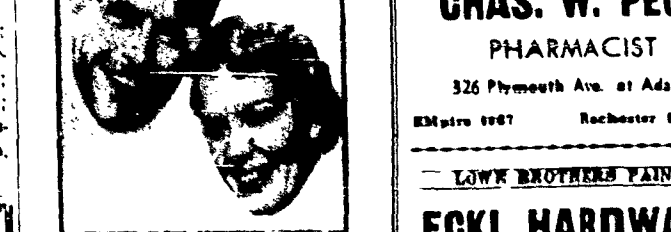
### Says Aquinas Eleven Spreads City's Fame
