Holy Year Buses Resume With 11,576 Mark Standing

With 11,576 already carried by bus on Holy Year pilgrimages the Rochester Transit Corporation this week announced resumption of pilgrimage service through December 31.

To aid parish groups of societies in making the pilgrimages to gain the Holy Year indulgence, the RTC is providing charter bus service from one location to the four pilgrimage churches every evening as well as Sunday afternoon and return.

Visits to the Pro-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart, St. Joseph's, Old St. Mary's and Our Lady of Victory Churches are required to gain the Holy Year indulgence.

ST. AMBROSE LEADS Rochester area parishes with 227 pilgrims while the Pro-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart is second with 200. Holy Cross third with 740 and Holy Family fourth with 716.

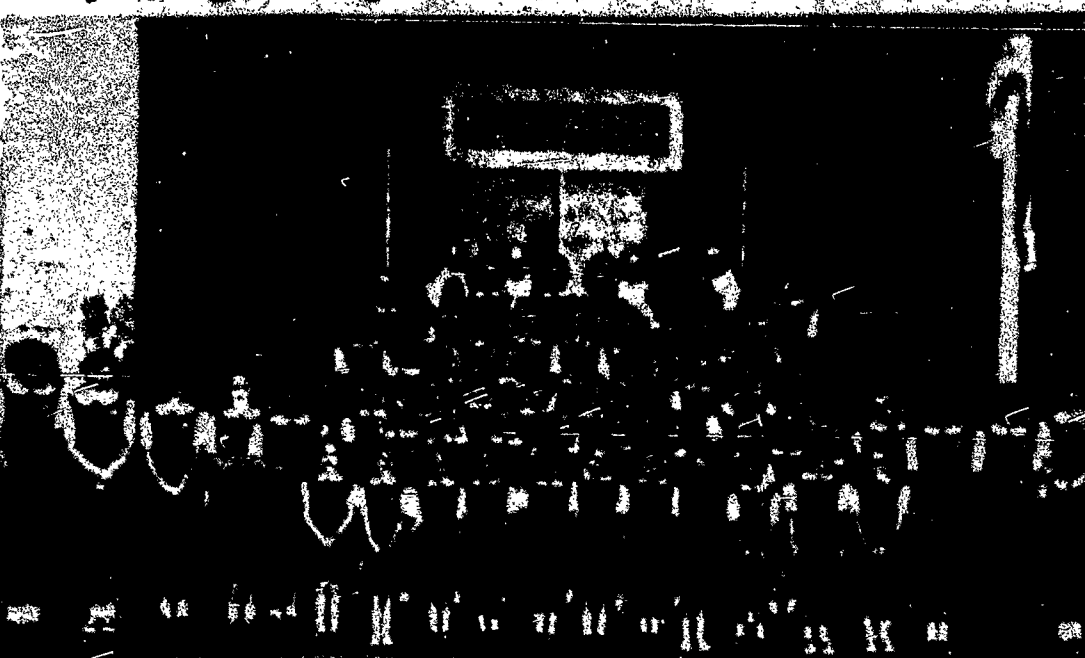
