

College Opening Marks Bishop's Anniversary

His 43rd anniversary in the Holy Priesthood Wednesday, Sept. 19, found His Excellency Bishop Kearney, educator and builder, speaking to the first class in the newly opened St. John Fisher College for men conducted by the Basilian Fathers on Fairport Road near Rochester.

The Bishop was ordained Sept. 19, 1908 and celebrated his First Solemn Mass in St. Agnes Church, New York City, where he had made his First Holy Communion.

From his earliest days in the priesthood he has been an organizer and builder. He was the first pastor of St. Francis Xavier Church in New York City. Prior to ordination he had made distinguished courses in studies at Teachers College, St. Joseph Seminary, Dunwoodie, and after ordination at the Catholic University of America.

AN ABILENT New York, as Bishop of Salt Lake City where he was appointed July 4, 1932 and here in the Diocese of Rochester, where he came on Nov. 11, 1937, Bishop Kearney has recorded extensive progress in Catholic education and in building church structures.

The Bishop has directed expansion of Nazareth College for women on East Ave. He has worked under his guidance the opening of the modern and beautiful St. Andrew's Seminary on Buffalo Road and the addition of St. James Mercy Hospital.

Syracuse Convert, Air Force Vet To Join Benedictines

Edson Coleman, a convert from Methodism and former assistant to a Protestant chaplain at Wright Patterson Field at Dayton, Ohio has made arrangements to enter the Benedictine abbey at Conception, Mo., to begin studies for the priesthood.
