Funny People Cast God With Hollywood Extras

People often ask me why, in so many movies, prayer is either hashed or huzzed as if somebody were embarrassed or ashamed. Leaving the Hollywood preview of "Angels in the Outfield" a friend said to me, "You know the spirit of the thing is well but why W. H. Moorings? You suppose they made that little Catholic orphan say her grace as if she'd never been taught the right words?"

He knew that Donna Corcoran who played the part is a Catholic school girl; well raised in a Catholic home. The little orphan character she played had been raised from babyhood by the Sisters in a Catholic orphanage. Yet when she said grace she was made to use a garbled, non-descript string of terms which had little or nothing to do with the recognized, Catholic act of thanksgiving.

In Warner's "Operation Pacific" a nun in charge of a party of infant refugees said grace in proper form except that she chopped off the final golden words, "through Jesus Christ Our Lord," which, incidentally, I have yet to hear in any motion picture.

GENERAL REFERENCES to God, in some motion pictures, are similarly evasive. In one new picture, "The Day the Earth Stood Still," which is a highly entertaining even though deliberately fantastic tale about a man and a robot from another planet who make a sweet landing in Washington via a flying saucer, the one fleeting hint of God's supremacy refers to Him as the "Almighty Spirit." This sounds like something out of a tale about Red Indian tribes. Why did they evade the use of the blessed name of God? Time and again in the movies

It is also true, of course, that in some countries censorship rules forbid invocation of the Deity. In Great Britain, practice excludes from the movies prayers properly and directly addressed to God with a minor exception or two taken from the Lord's Prayer and the Church of England common book of prayer.

British critics frequently urge upon their readers that all religious matter in films is on the embarrassing side and not altogether in the best of taste. Other countries abroad have set up various edicts which militate against the frank and open use of prayer, references to identifiable religious forms and so on.

THE RESULT IS to discourage a use of situations and dialogue of religious character regardless of their logical and justifiable relationship to the drama in hand. Among the studio people themselves this indifferent attitude presents the servants of anti-Christ with a golden opportunity which they are quick to seize. "Better cut that stuff out," they say, "because it's controversial!"

Often they are glad to leave it out of their movies anyway, because deep down their agnosticism or atheism finds them taking the well-known line. It takes a terrible war. Then in Hollywood they all begin to make a star of God. Unless and until we are in deep trouble He at best is cast among the Hollywood extras. Funny people, aren't we?
