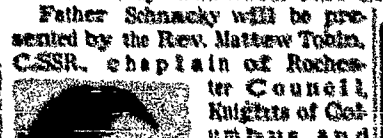

### First Friday Club Lists Talk By Father Schnacky

Rev. Albert H. Schnacky, diocesan director of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine will address men of the First Friday Luncheon Club at Hotel Sheraton, Oct. 5.



Father Schnacky will be presented by the Rev. Matthew Tobin, CSSR, chaplain of Rochester Council, Knights of Columbus and club moderator at the luncheon at 12:35 p.m.

Fr. Schnacky in his position supervises the released time program for religious instruction to Catholic pupils attending public schools and directs the summer Religious Vacation Schools.

He was ordained by His Excellency Bishop Kearney, June 5, 1943 and served at St. Andrew's Church, Rochester, and St. Mary's, Auburn, prior to his appointment to the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine on July 8, 1947.

His office is in the Columbus Civic Center and at present he is arranging to take a prominent role in the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine national convention to be held in Chicago in November.

All Catholic men who have received Holy Communion on the first Friday are eligible to attend the session according to Urban Kress, chairman of the K. of C. sponsoring committee. The session is over at 1:15 p.m. he said.

### God Must Be In World Plan, 2000 Told At Niagara

"The difficulties of the world today are caused by not asking for the plan of God and, until nations realize that God has something to say about His world, there is no peace and there cannot be peace," Catholics were told Saturday by the head of the department of philosophy at Niagara University.

The Rev. Frederick J. Russell, C.M., in delivering the principal address at the Friday talks at the university student center before an estimated 2,000 non-Catholics, said that it is "very difficult for us to match our wit against the wisdom of Almighty God with any assurance of success."

The Rt. Rev. Magr. Paschal J. Tronolone, pastor of St. Joseph's church and dean of Niagara County priests presided at Solemn Benediction following Father Russell's address. Magr. Tronolone was assisted by the Very Rev. Francis X. Desmond, C.M., rector of Our Lady of Angels seminary at Niagara University and the Rev. Eugene W. Womler, C.M., assistant superior.

In a spectacular demonstration of faith, men, women and children knelt in prayer for the recitation of the Rosary. The living Rosary was formed by Our Lady of Angels' seminarians and Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus.

The Very Rev. Francis L. Meade, C.M., president of the university extended Niagara's welcome to the large gathering.
