Word has reached here of the death in Williamsville, N. Y., of James Mackin, 63, former Rochesterian and father of a Sister of Mercy in Rochester.

Mr. Mackin, a native of Hornell, is survived by one daughter, Sister Mary Agatha, R.S.M., of St. Charles Borromeo Convent. He died Sept. 6, 1951. Burial was in Hornell.

Mr. Mackin conducted a bakery in Hornell until 1931 when he moved to Rochester. He served as maintenance man at Old St. Mary's Church until 1945, when he moved to Williamsville.

\$12,000 Monastery Art Gift Shown in Elmira Gallery

Restored through the cooperation of Elmira Council, Knights of Columbus, a 14th Century work of art, valued at \$12,000 and the property of Mount Savior Monastery near Elmira is in display at the Arnot Art Gallery in Elmira.

The art treasure is a triptych owned by the Monastery conducted by the Benedictine Fathers near Elmira and was offered to the Arnot Art Gallery on loan because the temporary monastery has no place to show properly the beauty of the masterpiece.

"The triptych is our greatest art treasure," the Rev. Dom Gregory Borgstedt, O.S.B., superior of the monastery, said. "We are grateful for the opportunity of having it well cared for and we are happy to be able to share it with all of our good neighbors."

THE ARTIST of the three-panel painting on wood is unknown. Actually, according to Gallery Director Earlind Anderson, it probably is the work of several artists — painters and wood-carvers — and is believed to have been executed in a monastery in Southern France.

The authenticity of the painting has been verified by experts, who based its age on several points typical of the Avignon School of the 14th Century.

THE TRIPTYCH is made of oak including the hand-carved frame. The panels originally were covered with gesso, an undercoating for the egg tempera painting. The tempera has been retouched with oil paint over the years and now is finished as an oil painting.

The three panels together measure close to ten feet long by just under six feet high. The center panel depicts the Crucifixion.
