Diocesan Priest Named To Staff Of Men's College

The Rev. Joseph L. Hogan, Ph.D., recently returned from Rome, has joined the faculty of St. John Fisher College as Professor of Theology, according to the Rev. John F. Murphy, C.S.B., Ph.D., President of the college.

Father Hogan, son of Mrs. Michael C. Hogan of Lima, attended St. Rose School and Lima High School. St. Andrew's Seminary and St. Bernard Seminary. He was ordained to the priesthood on June 8, 1942.

His first assignment was assistant at St. Mary's Elmira from June 1942 to September 1945. He was then assigned to St. Andrew's Seminary as Professor of Latin and Science. He did graduate work in history and education at Canisius College and received his master of arts degree on June 5, 1949.

In September of 1949, Father Hogan began graduate studies in conducted by the Dominican Fathers. He received his degree of doctor of theology in May, 1951.

Father Hogan is continuing his work as Professor of Apologetics and Latin at St. Andrew's Seminary.

Father Hogan's brother is the Rev. Michael Hogan, assistant pastor at St. Francis de Sales Geneva.

One writer has said: "The Feast of the Rosary is a real summary of the Liturgical year." On Sunday, Oct. 7, 1571, this feast was instituted as a special commemoration of a victorious battle through which the forces of Islam were prevented from invading Europe. Gregory XIII designated the Feast for certain churches but Clement XI extended it to the entire Catholic world in thanksgiving for an-

other triumph in 1716.

Then Our Holy Father, Leo XIII, raised the feast to second class to obtain Our Lady's aid amidst the trials of Holy Mother Church at that time. So now, almost 400 years after the first Rosary Sunday, an observance is being planned in a new Rosary Paradise.

BISHOP KEARNEY has designated the Elmira Monastery as the central headquarters for the Rosary in the Rochester Diocese. It is our privilege to be so close to this Spiritual Powerhouse that we may with little sacrifice make this Novena to our Lady.

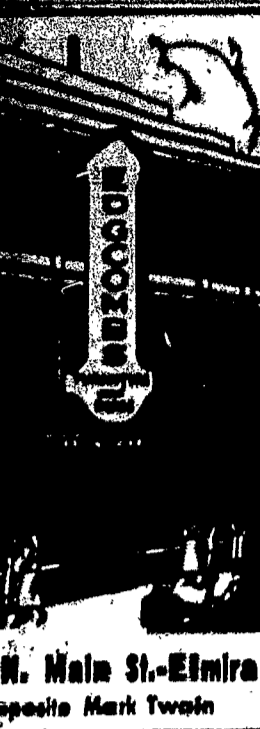
