### Catholic Girls' Colleges Open In India, Pakistan

Ernakulam, India (NC)—Two new Catholic women's colleges have been opened in India and Pakistan.

The first is at Tiruvalla in Travancore Cochin under the auspices of Bishop Joseph Mar Severius, Malankara Rite Ordinary of Tiruvalla. The Bishop set aside a plot of 30 acres of land for the college, which is staffed and managed by Sacred Heart nuns from England.

THE NEW institution will be the 43rd Catholic college in India. Plans are afoot for two more Catholic colleges in Travancore-Cochin, one for women at Changanacherry under Bishop Matthew Kavuratt and another for men at Muvattupuzha under Archbishop Augustine Kandathil of Ernakulam.

Catholics conduct 14 women's university colleges in India. In Travancore Cochin they have been pioneers in the women's education movement. The only two women's colleges in this state are run by Carmelite sisters.

### California Vote OK Sought On School Tax Exemption

San Francisco (NC)—Presentation of the full story of private school contributions to the State of California will be made by the committee for Justice in Education in an endorsement of state tax exemption for non-profit schools in a forthcoming referendum.

Near unanimous approval of a bill giving non-profit schools tax exemption was voted last spring by the California legislature bringing California into line with the 47 other States in this regard. However, foes of the tax exemption gathered enough petition signatures to force suspension of the law until a referendum is held on whether the law should take effect.

It is now too late for signs to be withdrawn. Their signatures at the next general election.

ROBERT McCARTHY, northern chairman of the Committee for Justice in Education, announced that the committee will contact signers of the petition in the next few days to get their names on a photostatic copy of the petition. The committee will then present the petition to the Registrar of Voters.

Full facts on the tax will be presented to the signers, and it is hoped many will change their minds and endorse the tax exemption when they vote in the referendum.

The petition has been qualified with the Secretary of State for a referendum ballot. However, the committee believes that many signed in order to help the professional petition circulators, who were paid approximately \$1 per signature.

While at Gethsemani Frater Dennis was elected superior of the new Lady of the Geneesee Monastery, but ill health kept him from making the trip with his confreres. Although diagnosed as suffering from an incurable disease, he decided to come to New York State to aid in the building project and was placed in charge of the volunteer help.

TEN DAYS BEFORE his death Frater Dennis became seriously ill and was taken to St. Mary's. When death appeared imminent Frater Dennis, who was expected to have been in bed for a few weeks, said his greatest desire was to attend Mass.

At the time of his death the Sacrament was offered in his room in the monastery by Father Most. Frater Dennis also received the Last Rite of Holy Viaticum on the three nights he lay in St. Mary's Hospital, as reported by the Rev. M. Vincent de Paul.

Frater Dennis' remains were buried in the cemetery of the community, where he was buried in the presence of his confreres and his family.

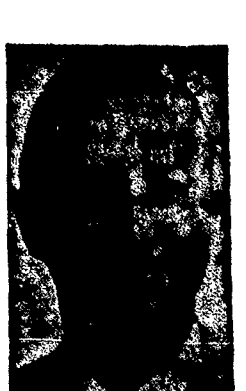
