

G.M. Gowney Rites Conducted At St. Andrew's Sister Gonzaga's Services Held At Motherhouse

Funeral services for Sister M. Gowney, who died Thursday, Sept. 27, 1951, at Nazareth convent, Pittsford, after a long illness, were held on Monday, Oct. 1.

St. Ignace Mass of Requiem was celebrated in Holy Family Chapel of Nazareth convent by the Rev. John F. Murphy, C.S.B. He was assisted by Rev. Raymond F. Moore, Deacon, Rev. Charles B. Connell, Subdeacon; Rev. John D. Malley, Master of Ceremonies; Rev. George T. McCall and Rev. William J. O'Brien, Acolytes; Rev. Joseph H. Gebel, Thurifer. Also present in the sanctuary were Rev. Louis W. Edelman and Rev. John A. Murphy. At the grave, the last blessing was given by Father Gebel.

Sister Gowney entered the community of the Sisters of Saint Joseph in 1886 and taught for many years in the schools of Geneva and Waterloo as well as in Holy Apostles and St. Augustine's Schools in Rochester.

Surviving are several nieces and nephews.

Sons Officiate At Rites For Arthur B. Reddington

Two priest-sons officiated at solemn funeral services of Arthur B. Reddington, 44 Alliance Ave. held at Blessed Sacrament Church on Monday, Oct. 1.

Mr. Reddington, 70, died in Highland Hospital, Sept. 27, 1951.

Celebrant of the Solemn Funeral Mass was the Rev. Thomas Reddington, assistant pastor of St. John the Evangelist's Church, assisted by his brother, Rev. John A. Reddington, assistant pastor of St. Ambrose Church, as deacon and the Rt. Rev. Magr. Thomas F. Connors as subdeacon. In attendance were 71 other priests.

Mr. Reddington retired in 1939 after having been in the plumbing and heating business for 43 years.

He was a graduate of Immaculate Conception school and attended the old Rochester Free Academy before going to work for the Reynolds Company where he learned the plumbing trade. He also worked for the R. T. Ford Company and later was in business for himself.

Among other large contracts while in business, Mr. Reddington installed the heating and plumbing system in St. Margaret Mary's School and St. Stanislaus School.

HE WAS A member of the Holy Name Society of Blessed Sacrament Church and the Northern Adoration Society. He at one time held membership in the Knights of Columbus.

Besides his two priest-sons, he is survived by his wife, Margaret, another son Richard T. Reddington; two daughters, Miss Margaret Appley; four grandchildren and a sister Mrs. Jane Thomas all of Rochester.

fell from the lips of Our Lord on the hillsides of Galilee.

All this the Bishop noted, has been under the patronage and protection of the great St. Michael, whom the Church day after day asks to defend us in battle, and whose presence and protection in our current conflicts against the forces of evil is more necessary than ever before in the history of the world.

"The dedication of this church to St. Michael," declared the bishop, "is a vital force in this community and in this diocese."

Bishop Kearney challenged his listeners to be aware always that so very much had been achieved by the early pioneers, always against such overwhelming odds. He asked that everyone pray that the Catholic of today with so much in his favor might achieve as much as the pioneer of a century ago.
