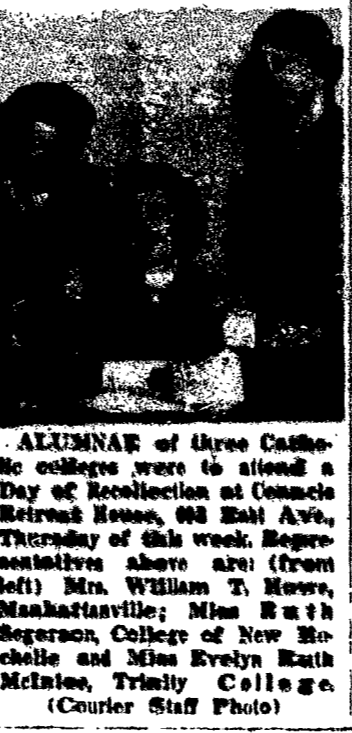

The new wing contains four class rooms, teachers' room, library, science laboratory, principal's office and showers.

THE NEW GYM is on a lot directly west of the school. It is about 82 feet wide, 120 feet long and 22 feet high. At one end there is a modern stage about 45 by 33 feet. There are two dressing rooms, one on each side of the stage. Other features include a room for chair storage, and an office and lavatories. Walls of the gym are two-toned tan and cream. An eight section lighting arrangement is used, each section containing five separate lights. An attractive electric score board hangs on the entrance wall of the gym.
