In order for the Menzies proposal to be adopted, the Government had to win in four states as well as obtain a majority in the total Federal vote.

The largest "Yes" majority was in Queensiand, where Archbishop James Duhig of Brisbane publicly supported the Menzies proposal, advocating a "Yes" vote. No other member of the Catholie Mierarchy took sides, although several spoke on the referendum in general terms, principally stressing that no official policy had been stated by the Church.




