Mission Poultry Farm Prospers

Molina, Chile—(NC)—When Colegio Gonzalo Correa was founded four years ago, it received a gift of 25 chickens to start a poultry farm. Today it has nearly 1,000 chickens, cared for by the students. Recently a class from the neighboring state agricultural school visited Colegio to study its techniques in poultry raising.

Founded by the Rev. James F. McNitz, Maryknoll Missioner from Peabody, Mass., the agricultural-industrial school provides poor boys with a liberal education and manual training. They are taught Christian ideals and principles, and also are trained in carpentry, mechanics, poultry raising, livestock care, and agriculture.

The General Fund of the Society created as follows: 60% Ordinary memberships, 100% Special and Perpetual memberships and legacies and 51% of the Mission Sunday Collection, is distributed by the Supreme Council at the Vatican City. Of the total contributed last year, American Catholics gave 50%, but our per capita giving was only \$1.13. When divided among 601 ecclesiastical provinces, it provided but 15% of their total maintenance needs.

Out of Ordinary memberships, 40% goes to the support of our own Home Missions. In addition, 9% of the collection provides for the Missions of the Near East where indescribable poverty abounds.
