

Women In Public Life Needed, Says Nun-Lawyer

Toronto—(NC) His Holiness Pope Pius XII has made it clear that he wants "Catholic women—not special ones, but all of them—to get into public life as a means of safeguarding the home from dangers. Sister Ann Joachim, Dominican nun-lawyer, told a convention of 200 Catholic women here.

She also reminded her listeners of the counsel given by Clare Boothe Luce, noted convert author: "Mark it well—this temporary sojourning beyond the portals of her household is enjoined upon woman only to secure her permanent position in the home."

"WE CANNOT afford to be ignorant of other peoples and the conditions under which they live," Sister Joachim said. "We can as intelligent Catholic women, by concerted effort, attain an influence that will break down the hate, the bitterness, the jealousies, the intolerance, the bigotries and the intriguing politics that keep man and nations apart."

Sister Ann Joachim is stationed at Siena Heights College, Adrain, Mich. She practiced law in Detroit before entering religious life and as a nun was admitted to practice before the U. S. Supreme Court. She also holds an air pilot's license. She was one of the principal speakers at the convention of the Canadian Federation of Convent Alumnae at St. Michael's College here.

Leftist Teachers' School Control Bid Seen Doomed

Sydney (NC) A plan sponsored by the Communist influenced Teachers Federation for the establishment of an Education Commission to control all education appears certain to be frustrated.

If the Federation's proposals are placed before the cabinet, in accordance with an undertaking given by Education Minister R. J. Heffron it seems certain that the cabinet in which there is a strong Catholic representation, would emphatically reject them.

THE FEDERATION'S plan was that all education in the state should be placed in the hands of the commission consisting of two representatives of the government and two of the Federation and a chairman "acceptable to both."

The Federation's move was exposed here by The Catholic Weekly, which branded it "the gravest threat to Catholic education in the history of Australia."

Following this exposure the matter was featured prominently in the daily press here, which published strong editorials denouncing the scheme.

Persecution Chief Anxiety Of Church

London (NC) What he described as the "chief anxiety" of the Holy See were outlined by Archbishop William Godfrey, Apostolic Delegate to Britain.

Preaching in St. Mary's Cathedral, Edinburgh, at the consecration of the Most Rev. Gordon Joseph Gray as Archbishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh the Apostolic Delegate listed these "anxieties" as follows:

(1) PERSECUTION in the countries where the enemies of religion are in power and where Christians are the object of bitter and persistent attack.

(2) Catholic education — "the fate of the little one, the hope of the Church for the future their education in true Christian godliness."

(3) THE PERILS besetting family life, the degradation of marriage and the dignity of womanhood.

(4) The spate of calumny broadcast and printed against God and the Church, and

(5) The present stirring up of class warfare which would not only fail to provide a remedy for social evils but would inflict a mortal wound on that spirit of Christian charity by which only the world "can be righted."

Nuns To Donate Blood For Soldiers

New York (NC) Four hundred fifty Sisters of this archdiocese are expected to make blood donations in one group at St. Vincent's Hospital here on October 12, Columbus Day—reportedly the largest single group donation in the history of the New York Red Cross regional blood program.

The gift of the nuns comes in response to the appeal of His Eminence Francis Cardinal Spellman, Archbishop of New York, for members of the clergy and religious to give blood for the armed forces.
