

Charities Name Changed To Family Center

Catholic Charities became Catholic Family Service at a meeting of the Board of Governors on Monday, Oct. 8, the change, which is in line with the United States Agency for International Development's new descriptive name and functions of the agency.

The Catholic Family and Community Center, Inc., is now the case work agency for the social, emotional and economic status of the Catholic Family Service. Occasionally, the social work must be given as a Case Work Tool, also as part of a plan to enable people to live more comfortably with themselves and others.

IN AN ELECTION of officers during this meeting, the present incumbents were re-elected for a one year term, beginning Oct. 1. The Excellency, the Most Rev. James E. Kearney, D.D., is President and the Rt. Rev. Eugene William J. Ryan, V.G., Vice President. Executive Chairman is Anthony J. Burke, Vice Chairman, Mrs. Fred W. Casner, Treasurer, and Joseph Spiegel, Secretary.

Other changes include an increase in the Personnel of the

Board with seven new appointments and three expired terms to be filled. This will raise the membership of the Board to thirty. Slates for these elections were presented by Mrs. Spiegel as a member of the Nominating Committee of the Board.

Guam Almost Totally Catholic

Agaña, Guam — (NC) — The number of Catholics on Guam, which this year is marking its 40th anniversary as a Vicariate Apostolic, has greatly increased in that time. With a total population of 26,800 on this United States Island possession, there are 28,468 Catholics.

This increase is ascribed partly to the natural process of generation and partly to the influx of many Catholic Filipinos and American mainlanders of the faith. In fact, says Umatuna S. S. S., the Catholic Vicariate publication, there are many mainland dioceses which have fewer Catholics than the Vicariate Apostolic of Guam.

He was consecrated by Archbishop Leo Kierkeis, C.P., Papal Interspuncio to India.

Smith Dinner Lists Cardinal, U. S. Envoy

New York — (NC) — U. S. Ambassador to Russia Alan G. Kirk will address the seventh annual Alfred E. Smith Foundation dinner at 18 Waldorf-Astoria here October 15. It was announced by His Eminence Francis Cardinal Spellman, Archbishop of New York and president of the foundation.

MR. KIRK'S ADDRESS will be broadcast over the ABC radio network on that evening from 10 to 10:30 (E.S.T.) and Cardinal Spellman will be heard exclusively over the Mutual broadcasting chain from 10:45 to 11. Other speakers at the dinner will be Gov. Thomas E. Dewey and Acting Mayor Joseph T. Sharkey.

As in the past, total cost of the \$100-a-plate dinner will be met by an anonymous advertiser of Governor Smith and a friend of Cardinal Spellman. This allows the full amount of subscriptions and other donations to be turned over to the Alfred E. Smith Memorial Hospital which was dedicated last May.

Purposes of the foundation are:

"To perpetuate the ideals of Alfred E. Smith of raising funds to aid the poor, the sick and the underprivileged regardless of race, creed or color; to render voluntary assistance in the financing of worthy charitable projects which seek to alleviate the sufferings of the indigent; to collect and distribute money to help finance the capital needs and maintenance obligations of institutions dedicated to the care of the aged, the orphaned and the afflicted; to render assistance to those in want . . ."

Choirs to Compete In Sacred Heart Program Contest

St. Louis — (NC) — The world-wide Sacred Heart Program, which is carried regularly on 1,000 radio stations, has announced a competition open to vocal groups throughout the United States and Canada for the best rendition of the program's theme song, "O Sacred Heart, O Love, Divine."

KNOWN as the Fred Waring Sacred Heart Program Competition, the contest invites entries from musical groups in Catholic colleges, universities and seminaries. The three classifications for choir, glee club or chorus will be mixed, male and female. Winner in each class will receive a trophy and be heard regularly on the Sacred Heart Program, "Voice of the Apostleship of Prayer."

The arrangement to be used has been provided by the Fred Waring Organization. Judges will be Fred Waring, the band director; Roy Ringwald, Waring organization arranger; Mario Salvador, St. Louis Cathedral organist and musical director of the Sacred Heart Program; and Robert Mitchell, director of the Mitchell Boy Choir of Hollywood.


NO TRAVEL is required for contest entrants. They need only record the Fred Waring arrangement of the program's theme song in their own chapel, auditorium, or local radio station. The hymn may be sung a capella (without accompaniment) or with organ accompaniment. The Rev. William K. Schweinher, S.J., production manager of the Sacred Heart Program, whose headquarters is here, is in charge of the competition, which begins October 15 and ends next January 15.


