Judges will be Fred Waring, the band di rector, Roy Ringwald, Waring organization arranger, Mario Salvador, St. Louis Cathedralor ganist and musical director of the Sacred Heart Program; and Robert Mitchell, director of the Mitchell Boy Choir of Hollywood.
