Marine, Army Man Reported On Korea Wounded List

Two Catholics have been reported wounded in action during the past week.

They are Marine PFC. William F. McAvoy, son of Mrs. Elizabeth L. McAvoy, 678 Geneva St., and Cpl. Morgan F. Dunn, son of Mr. and Mrs. Gerald E. Dunn, 506 Chilli Ave.

According to a letter received by PFC. McAvoy's mother he was wounded around Sept. 10. Previously a mortar barrage sent McAvoy to a base hospital on August 29, with a shoulder wound.

Cpl. Dunn was wounded in the arm with shell fragments. He is a member of the 27th Reconnaissance Combat Team. Following basic training at Fort Dix he attended Army leadership school and was sent to Korea in July.

Marine Pfc. Morgan McAvoy was recalled to duty from the reserve in November 1950 and has been serving with the First Marine Division in Korea since June.

Both men are graduates of Aquinas Institute and McAvoy was graduated from the Loyola Institute of Los Angeles.

Holy Rosary Men To Receive Communion
