play. It is the first such exhibit the Gallery has ever displayed, he said.

Several articles have been provided by St. Joseph's Church, Rochester, including a "Gospel Book" with a rich cover decoration incorporating pictures of the Evangelists. This book is carried in the Eastern Rite church in solemn processions to symbolize the fact that Christ still lives among us in this world, the explanatory card says.

A missal in Slavic type drawn interest and is displayed by the Rev. Nicholas Wolensky, pastor of St. Joseph's.

One monstrance shown is in the traditional sunburst design and another is shaped in simple modern lines.

A ROMAN MISSAL, displayed through the courtesy of Father Murphy, was printed and bound in Germany. Illuminated Gospels, printed in Armenian in 1260, is from among the Gallery's own collection.

The Pontifical vestments of a Bishop, including mitre, two dalmatics, ceremonial buskins, gloves and shoes, and loaned by His Excellency Bishop Kearney, are on display along with the crozier belonging to Bishop Bernard J. McQuaid, the founder of the Diocese of Rochester.

Other exhibits include the Cenacle Convent, East Ave.; Sacred Heart Convent, Prince St.; St. Andrew's Seminary, Rev. Paul E. Tufts, Chaplain of the University of Rochester Newman Club; William J. Woerner and sons, and Trans.
