

St. Bonaventure U. Head To Speak At Charities Dinner

The Very Rev. Juvencio Lalor, O.F.M., president of St. Bonaventure's University will be the principal speaker at the annual dinner of the Catholic Family Service, Elmira. The affair will be held at the Mark Twain Hotel on Monday evening Oct. 29.

Attorney Daniel J. Donahoe has been named general chairman of the banquet and Attorney John D. Frawley, vice chairman. Other committee chairmen and members are to be announced.

This occasion will mark the 22nd anniversary of the organization which last week changed its name from Catholic Charities to Catholic Family Service.

FATHER LALOR was named 12th president of the University on July 13, 1949 and is a former head of the department of philosophy of the school. He received his bachelor of Arts degree at St. Bonaventure's in 1933 and was ordained to the Priesthood in 1936.

In 1937 Father Lalor joined the faculty of St. Joseph's Semaphic Seminary and a year later was transferred to St. Bonaventure's to teach English and Philosophy at the seminary of Christ the King.

FROM 1939 to 1943, Father Lalor took up higher studies and received a Master of Arts degree from the University of Toronto in 1941, attending the Pontifical Institute of Medieval Studies at the same time. A Doctor of Philosophy degree was conferred on him at Laval University, Quebec in 1943. Upon returning to St. Bonaventure's in 1943, Father Lalor was appointed spiritual director of the Seminary and professor of philosophy and was placed in charge of the philosophy department in 1946.

Mrs. Frank Curtin of Rochester, provincial director and representative of the National Council of Catholic Women, will extend greeting to the delegates and guests.

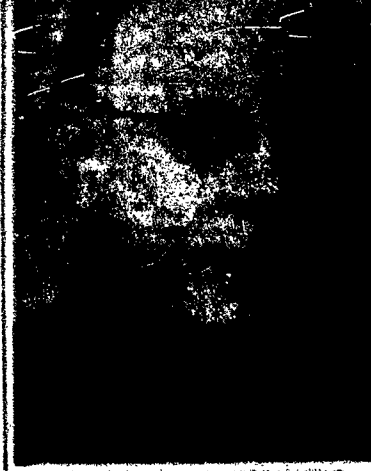

\$318,944 Sought In Chest Campaign Set In Chemung

The 1951 Chemung County Community Chest fund raising campaign gets under way Oct. 16 with the largest goal in its history, \$318,944, making it the largest challenge volunteers in the area have ever tackled.

Chairman for the 1951 drive is Franklin B. Peltier, President of Thatcher Glass Mfg. Co., Inc. assisted by three co-chairmen, John E. Sullivan, prominent Elmira attorney, Richard G. Kalk, owner of the Gordon Coy, and John E. Vernal, general manager of the Elmira plant of Messer's Business Forms.

MORE THAN 2,000 additional volunteer workers will start the countywide collection on Oct. 16 to raise \$318,944 for 23 Red Feather agencies including the United Defense Fund, including the USO, and the Heart Association. The Red Feather agencies have an individual budget of \$25,000 while the Heart Association is set to receive \$25,000.

While this is the largest goal in Chemung County Chest history, most regular Red Feather agencies reduced their budgets from last year. Some of them, however, due to increased operation expenses, faced by every organization today, had to ask for additional money to maintain their services during 1951.

All budgets for all agencies are subject to monthly review by members of the Budget Committee of the Chest, headed by Arthur H. Burr, Jr., and composed of leading Elmira business men. These men check every figure in an effort to keep operating costs at the lowest possible and budgets for the following year, upon which the total amount of the campaign is based, are individually examined and approved by the Budget Committee before they are accepted as final.

Actually, every cent requested in the 1951 campaign is necessary to keep up the vital services they render constantly to our community.

"WHEN A GROUP of representative hard-headed business men go over every cent of these budgets," Mr. Burr said, "every contributor can be sure that the money is vitally needed."

Slogan for the drive is "People are More Important Than Anybody" based on the idea that every agency and every act performed by Chest Agencies during the year is for and with the people. In addition, every job is a local one and the work of all agencies is for the local people.
