# Congress OK's 80,000 Men Parade For Holy Name Society Bishop Sheen Sees Communism Doubles **Bill Admitting** Nuns To U.S.

Congress has approved a bill admitting five Roman Catholic nuns to the United States outside the normal immigration quota after being advised that . there is a shortage of workers in religious vocations in the United States.

The bill, sponsored by Rep. James J. Murphy (D.N.Y.), provides that five Italian-born nuns. members of the Daughters of St. Paul, may remain in this country permanently and become citizens.

THE ITALIAN immigration is over-subquota at present is over-subscribed for many years ahead. and without a special act of Congress, the nuns would have been obliged to return to Italy.

"Calls for the services of the Sisters are far in excess of the ability which the limited number of nuns in this country can provide," said Rep. Murphy, in urging enactment of the bill.

"Since there has been a shortage of vocations of the religious life in the United States as compared to the demands made for services, it is felt that approval of the bill will produce a benefit for the country by permitting the five aisters to remain and perform the sociological and! charitable services of their


