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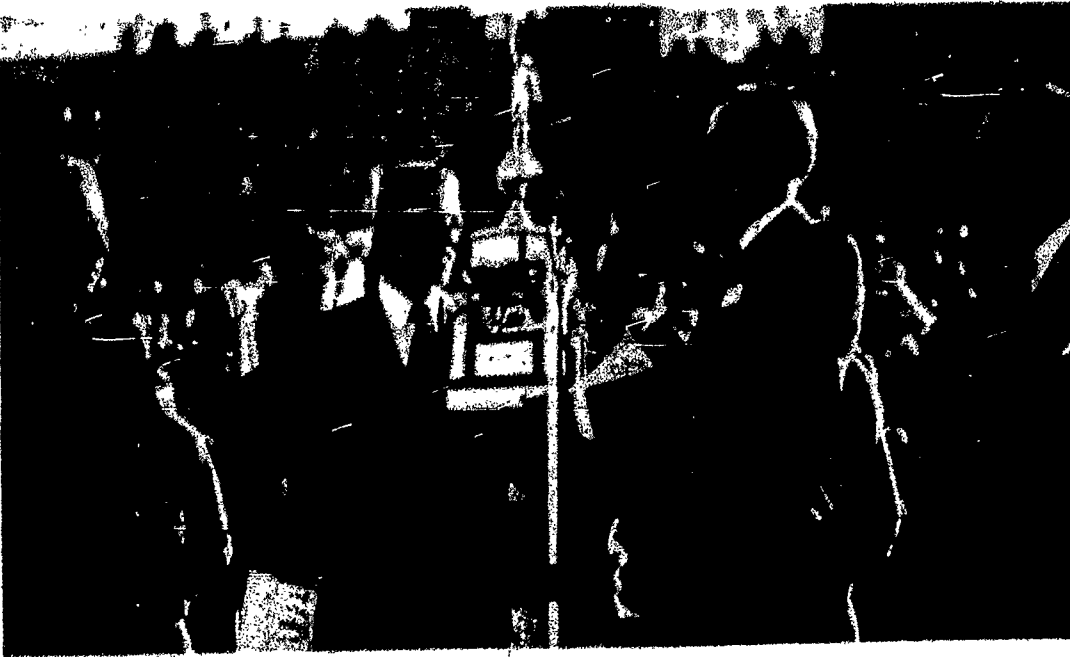
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National Magazine Sale Champions

Holy Family High Senior Boosts Community Chest

Selected as one of the exceptional essays on the Community Chest to be published in the Auburn Citizen Advertiser is the following by Maureen Fogarty, senior of Holy Family High School, Auburn.

Yes, it's Red Feather time once again! This year, Cayuga County's goal is \$217,046. The reason for the increased amount, is the fact that three more agencies are on the Community Chest's list: namely, United Service Organization, the cancer and cerebral palsy centers. Here is some factual information about your Community Chest:

In 1922, three prominent Auburnians, A. E. Vallin, E. N. Ross and William Elder believed that through Auburn's individual help an organization could be adopted to aid local social agencies. This was the beginning of the Auburn Chapter of the Community Chest.

AT THAT TIME, the Community Chest only provided for the people within a city. Three years ago it branched out into the Cayuga County Community Chest sponsoring all the needy agencies in the county area.

The Community Chest is governed like a small township. There is a board of directors, whose members are elected by the citizens who contributed to the previous year's campaign. Twice a year in January to decide what percentage of money received will be given to its "red feather" agencies.

THROUGH THE centuries especially in America the red feather has always been a sign of courage, achievement and responsibility. Before an Indian led could become a brave, he had to kill an eagle, take one of its feathers and dye it red. He wore it for a certain length of time, according to his tribe, in order to prove his bravery and skill.

In 1928, United Health and Welfare Agency under the Chest fund, adopted the red feather for its symbol. Not until 1945 did the red feather become the emblem which everyone knows as the national symbol of a great organization—the Community Chest!
