Ukrainian Church Pastor Listed For Friday Club

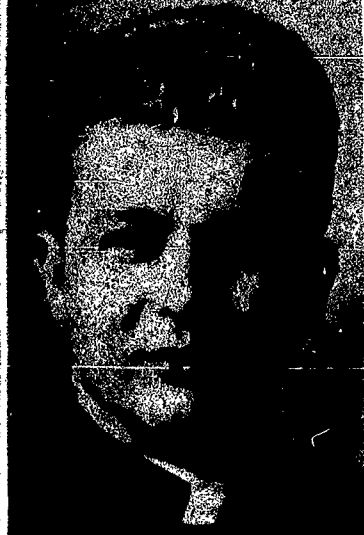
An Eastern Rites priest, the Rev. Nicholas Wolensky, pastor of St. Joseph's Church, 308 Hudson Ave., will speak to men of the First Friday Luncheon Club in Hotel Sheraton on Friday, Nov. 2.

Father Wolensky will explain the Byzantine rite of which he is a priest at the luncheon session beginning at 12:15 p. m. according to the Rev. Matthew Tobin, C.S.S.R., chaplain of Rochester Council, Knights of Columbus and club moderator.

ALL CATHOLIC men who have received Holy Communion on the First Friday are eligible to attend the session. Urban Kress, chairman of the K. of C. sponsoring committee said today, Father Wolensky was appointed pastor of St. Joseph's Ukrainian Catholic Church in January of 1950 by his bishop, the Most Rev. Constantine Bohachewsky, of Philadelphia. The young priest came from Philadelphia where he had been serving as assistant at the chancery of the Ukrainian Catholic Diocese in the United States.

HE IS THE founder of St. Nicholas of Nyza Church in Philadelphia. Father Wolensky studied for the Holy Priesthood in Switzerland. He completed his studies at the University of Innsbruck in Austria under the Jesuit Fathers and was ordained Sept. 27, 1941. He was named pastor of the Church of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary in Central Ia, Pa.
