

Aquinas Loses To Augusta, Faces Bullis Prep On Sunday

Its 12-game winning streak broken last Sunday in a stunning loss to Augusta Military Prep School, the Aquinas Institute Little Irish football squad faces an even tougher opponent at 2 p.m. next Sunday in Memorial Stadium — Bullis Prep School of Maryland.

Some 10,300 fans who expected to see the Little Irish walk away with their 12th straight victory last Sunday were shocked in the second half of a thrilling game to witness the big leads from Virginia riddle the Aquinas line with long gains and roll up a 20-18 convincing win.

Wounded Aquinas, suffering the loss particularly of Fullback Bobby Bjermeyer, injured the week before, gained a 7-0 edge at halftime. Augusta didn't get underway at all in the first two periods, and the crowd settled back expecting the Little Irish traditionally to pile up the score in the second frame.

It was in this half, however,

that the bruising all-prep school schedule Aquinas has been playing this year caught up with them. Augusta caught fire, and their two great backs, Sedbrook and Davidson, began making long gains through the Little Irish line.

Two Augusta drives brought the score to 17-0. Aquinas Coach Harry (Mickey) Connolly replaced Quarterback Jimmy Burns with Maury Ryan, who tossed a long pass to End Don Hollender to tie it at 13-13. But Augusta rolled back to take the lead 20-13.

The Little Irish tried desperately with passes to come back, but a fumble on their own 25-yard line set Augusta up for its final touchdowns and a 28-13 edge. Aquinas still was battling with all it had when the clock stopped proceedings.

Further complicating the Little Irish picture was the injury of Fullback Sammy Santandrea, who suffered two torn ribs

muscles and will be lost for the Bullis Prep fray.

BULLIS PREP comes to Memorial Stadium Sunday with its best squad in years, according to reports. Their five-straight record to date includes wins over Staunton Military, 41-6; Greenbrier Military, 60-6; George Washington, 28-20, and Kiski, 33-7.

The Augusta loss was the first for Aquinas since St. Benedict's beat them 25-9 two years ago. In the fall of 1949 Connolly's 1950 team was undefeated in eight games, and this year's squad had won three straight "before Augusta." For Coach Connolly it was the second loss in 20 games.

Connolly this week questioned whether his boys could win another this season. Remaining on the schedule are: Oct. 28—Bullis; Nov. 4—Fossil Prep of Connecticut; Nov. 11—St. Benedict's of New Jersey; Nov. 22 (Thanksgiving Day)—Manlius Military Academy.
