Jerusalem Abbey Prior Seeks Vocations In U. S.

The Very Rev. Dom Leo Rudloff, O.S.B. Prior of the Dormition Abbey, Jerusalem, was a visitor at the Benedictine Monastery in Elmira.

The famed Abbey in Jerusalem is so named for the reason that its church is built on Mt. Zion, on the site where our Blessed Mother closed her eyes in death prior to Her Assumption into Heaven, the Prior said.

The ancient Church, since destroyed, also included the Cenacle where Our Lord celebrated the Last Supper and instituted the Blessed Sacrament and where the Holy Spirit descended on our Lady and the Apostles on Pentecost.

FOR SOME time the Abbey has been closed due to political troubles but was reopened a year ago. The community is now happily stationed there again, observing full Monastic life.

There are at present nine Priests and 12 Brothers stationed at the Abbey and some difficulties are being encountered under present conditions to obtain local vocations. Present members are gathered from various countries and it is hoped that applicants can be obtained from this country.

Father Prior Leo spent a short time at the Elmira Benedictine community and renewed friendships with Father Damasus, Prior of the local Monastery.

Every effort is being made to return the famed Abbey to the place of prominence it once held. Plans are completed to establish it as a focal point for prayers for the conversion of the Jews and restoration of the devotion to our Blessed Mother.

Father Leo's headquarters in this area is at St. Mary's Abbey, 525 High Street, Newark, N. J.
