

# Aquinas Loses To Augusta, Bullis Prep On Sunday

Two Augustus drives brought the score to 13-7. Aquinas Coach Harry (Mickey) Connelly replaced Quarterback Jimmy Burns with Matt Ryan, who tossed a long pass to End Don Hollender to tie it at 13-13. But Augustus rolled back to take the lead 20-13. The Little Irish tried desperately with passes to come back, but a fumble on their own 25-yard line set Augustus up for its final touchdown and a 26-13 edge. Augustus still was battling with all it had when the clock stopped proceedings.

Further complicating the Little Irish picture was the injury of Halfback Sammy Santandrea, who suffered two torn rib muscles and will be lost for the Bullis Prep try.

**BULLIS PREP** comes to Memorial Stadium Sunday with its best squad in years, according to reports. Their five-straight record to date includes wins over Staunton Military, 41-6; Greenbrier Military, 60-6; George Washington 'B', 26-14; Wyoming Seminary 28-20, and Klakk, 33-7.

The Augustus loss was the first for Aquinas since St. Benedict's beat them 25-0 two years ago, in the fall of 1949. Connelly's 1950 team was undefeated in eight games, and this year's squad had won three straight "before Augustus." For Coach Connelly it was the second loss in 20 games. Connelly this week questioned whether his boys could win another this season. Remaining on the schedule are: Oct. 28 Bullis; Nov. 4—Fairfield Prep of Connecticut; Nov. 11—St. Benedict's of New Jersey; Nov. 22 (Thanksgiving Day)—Manlius Military Academy.

# Philippine Bishops Plead For Vote In National Election

Manila, P. I.—(NC)—An appeal to the voters of this country to exercise their right of suffrage in the forthcoming congressional and provincial elections has been issued by the Philippine Hierarchy.

In a joint statement on the electoral rights of Catholics in the elections scheduled for November 13, the Bishops of the Philippine Republic remind their faithful of their "very serious obligation in this matter."

**ASSERTING THAT** the Catholic Bishops of the Philippines are neither favoring any party nor sponsoring any specific candidate, the statement asks citizens to perform their duty "in an intelligent and Christian manner."

"Cast your vote 'coram Deo' (in the sight of God), in the consciousness that you will have to answer to God for the way in which you exercise this duty," the statement continues. "For upon the manner in which you exercise it will depend, in the final analysis, the prosperity and the very life of this nation."

"STUDY CAREFULLY" the platform and principles of the various political parties. Diligently search into the character of the various candidates. It is not sufficient that a man's public life seem clean and upright. If a man's personal life cannot stand examination in the light of Christian principles and morality, then he cannot be trusted to bear worthily the duties and powers of a legislator or public official.

The statement contains an exhortation to vote "courageously, freely, intelligently, in a Christian manner," and warns that to refrain from voting "will make you answerable before God."
