**Aid From A Bulletin**

Displaying on its modest masthead as the slogan the dictum of Our Holy Father Pope Pius XII "Go into action in a manner and way suitable for each," The Counsellor, official bulletin of the Rochester Diocesan Council, is sent each month to the presidents of affiliated councils and organizations.  
It is sincerely hoped by the editor and staff of this little news sheet that after the president has thoroughly read it, she passes it on to other women in the organization whom it may help or inspire or guide.

BECAUSE PUBLISHING is an expensive business even in terms of a four page mimeographed paper, the Diocesan Council sends the bulletin only to the aforementioned offices. However, any person who wishes a subscription may have one by paying one dollar a year.

The average bulletin contains a message from the Diocesan Moderator, a message from the Diocesan President, and then news and notes of diocesan and deanery council activities.

**Church Groups Exempted From Postal Increase**

Washington, D.C. (RNS) — Congress has given its final approval to legislation increasing postage rates but exempting religious groups from the increases on both second and third class mail.

Exemption of non-profit organizations from increases in third class bulk mail and circular rates was agreed to by House conferees as a final point of compromise on the legislation. The Senate had approved such exemptions but the House had not.

BOTH HOUSES had agreed to exempt religious publications from the increase in second class printed matter rates.

Conferees also agreed to exempt the exemption to all religious or educational material whether published for profit or not if it is designed specifically for use in school classrooms or in religious instruction classes. This was a concession to private publishers of Sunday school papers and religious instructional material who had testified at congressional hearings that their margin of profit is very small.

EXEMPTION OF church and educational groups from the third class rate increase was a victory for missionary groups. At Senate hearings representatives of missionary societies described how millions of pieces of literature are sent annually through the mails in appeals for support of American missionary work abroad.

Spokesmen for church periodicals, both Protestant and Roman Catholic, testified that the church press makes heavy use of third class mail to solicit new subscriptions and renewals.
