

Aquinas Gridders To Face Fairfield Prep

With its list of injured players beginning to sound like a litany, the "Little Irish" football squad of Aquinas Institute will line up with plenty of trepidation against Fairfield Prep of Connecticut at 2 p.m. Sunday in Memorial Stadium.

Crushed by its two-game loss on the last two Sundays—first double defeat in the six-year Aquinas "big-time" football history—and minus the loss of four of its "regulars," the Dewey Avenue grid group probably will raise cheers of relief if it can eke out a one-point victory over the New Englanders.

FAIRFIELD, with two wins and two losses thus far, and prefigured as a "breather" on Aquinas scheduling, comes to Rochester heartened by the Little Irish misfortunes and determined to keep their defeat ball rolling.

Darkening the remaining 1951 pigskin picture for Coach Harry (Mickey) Connolly are the St. Benedict Prep and Manlius Academy games, scheduled Nov. 11 and Thanksgiving Day. St. Benedict's, which trounced Aquinas 25 to 9 in 1949, has a 6-0 record to date this season.

HOME 11,000 fans worried through last Sunday's tilt against undefeated Bulls' Prep of Maryland, which shattered the weakened Little Irish line and backfield with long gains. The story of the game is evidenced by a single statistic—rushing yardage: Bulls, 329; Aquinas, 57. Bulls scored twice in the first half to lead 12-0, and three times in the third period to make it 35. Aquinas managed a single touchdown for 6 points in the third quarter.

Halfback Jimmy O'Dell's ball-carrying, in which he displayed spirit and speed, brought him the Aquinas Player of the Week award.

CONNOLLY'S charges now have a 3 won-2 lost season record. The successive defeats by Augusta Military Prep and Bulls give the coach a 18 won-3 lost record over three seasons.

Because of the impressive 1949-50 record of 15 wins against 1 loss, Aquinas abandoned high school opposition this year and scheduled all prep schools. Apparently this Sunday-after-Sunday strong prep school schedule is too much to ask of high school kids.

The Gray Knights of Greece, widely-famed champion drill corps, will perform during halftime this Sunday.
