Benedictine Prior Outlines Aims To Corning KC

Corning — Speaking before the Corning Council, Knights of Columbus, their ladies and friends last Thursday night, the Very Rev. Damasus Wines, O.S.B., prior of the Mount Saviour Monastery, now in the process of development between Elmira and Canton, described the hopes and plans of the community.

Father Damasus, formerly of the Abbey of Maria Laach at Koblenz, Germany, was introduced by the Rev. Ralph Neagle, chaplain at Bath Veterans Facility who is also chaplain for the local organization.

Coming to the United States in 1936, Father Damasus served as chaplain of the Benedictine Convent of Regina Laudis at Bethlehem, Connecticut, besides fulfilling duties as author, lecturer and retreat master.

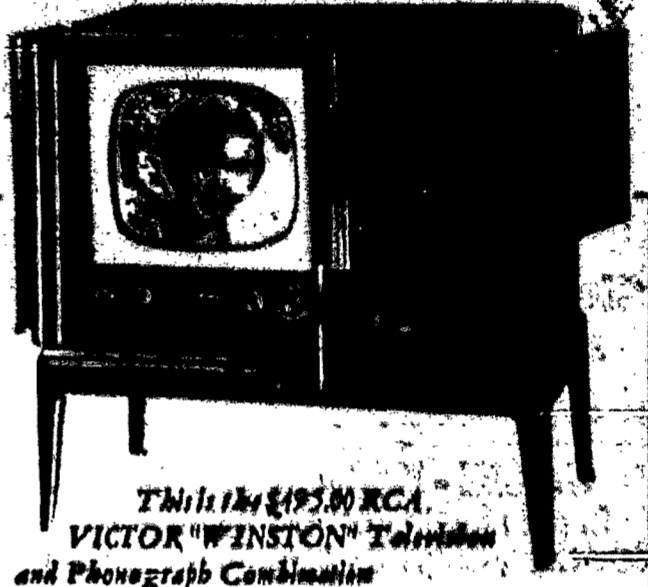
