### 750 In Night Courses LeMoyné College Enrolls

Syracuse, N. Y. (NC) Five hundred men and women from varied walks of life have enrolled for the first semester of a new four-year evening course in religion at LeMoyné College here. Another 250 are enrolled in an extension course at Utica, 50 miles away.

BASED ON THE four-year course for regular college students, the adult program involves detailed study of the Gospels, the Acts of the Apostles and the Epistles of St. Paul. Its purpose is to present this basic literature of Christianity in its entirety and then to sum it up in terms of the doctrine that the teaching authority of the Church has evolved in the last 2,000 years.

Enrollees include persons who did not attend college, converts seeking to deepen their knowledge received in their catechetical instruction; Catholics who have attended non-Catholic schools; and Catholic graduates wishing to enrich their education with new outlooks and appreciation of the values of religion in current affairs.
