

Hollywood In Focus

How Shameless Can We Get? Writer Asks

Around 1932-33 when Hitler was putting on the pressure in Germany, Seymour Nebenzal, born in New York and already a successful German film producer made a film called "M" which brought to light the star, Peter Lorre.

It told of a head murderer who slew innocents until the people, old and young, quietly joined forces to trap him.

The moral was intended to be clear to those of keen imagination, a characteristic not imputed to Hitler or his Brown Shirts. However, not so long thereafter Seymour Nebenzal like many others from the German film studios came to Hollywood.

Last year Nebenzal decided to remake "M."

He secured a releasing deal with Columbia Pictures since proved to have been many influenced by executives and artists of Communist sympathies.

He hired Joseph Losey to direct. Valida Sall was invited to write some of the dialogue. Howard Silva and Karen Morley, both like Losey and Sall involved in recent "Red" exposures were given important roles. Others with left-front records were thrown in to make up some of the most remarkable cast of American cinema ever found in a single movie.

WHEN THE UN-American Activities Committee turned on the searchlight some top level executives of Columbia admitted some of the picture "M"—and a few others they had contracted to release—really had them worried.

What could they do? If they refused to release the film Nebenzal might sue.

I told them then and I now repeat publicly that M. seemed to present Columbia Pictures with a wonderful opportunity for a great legal test case.

I suggested they abrogate their contract with Nebenzal. If the Courts did not uphold them,

which appeared unlikely, at least public opinion would.

They could show that Columbia and perhaps the whole movie business of Hollywood, stood prepared to put principle and prestige before profit. Columbia Pictures missed that opportunity.

Dropping the names of "M" is red-smudged cast into microscopic type, this movie company now advertises and releases this miserable picture, which the Legion of Decency finds objectionable because "it tends to glorify criminal activity."

In some places the theaters showing it add to this outrage by playing "M" on a double bill with Frances Langford's "Purple Heart Diary."

How downright shameless can we get?

FILM DIRECTOR Elia Kazan, one-time sympathizer with Hollywood's "Tongue-Tied Ten," will delight the hearts of moviegoers' "comrades" with his recent blast against the National Legion of Decency. They know that any attack upon the Legion is an attack upon the Church.

Writing in the New York Times, Kazan says the Warner Brothers were thrown into a panic when they learned the Legion was about to condemn the film "A Streetcar Named Desire," which he had directed for them.


"He upbraids the Warners for 'the nervousness they betrayed' and for snipping from the film 'twelve cuts' totaling three or four minutes, which left the picture subject to an 'objectionable' rating and avoided Legion of Decency condemnation."

All his (Williams') characters, writes Kazan, "are a mixture of the qualities we label 'good' and 'bad' and that is their humanity."

WHEN I SAW Kazan directing the film I asked him why he thought Tennessee Williams ever wrote the play. "Out of compassion for some underprivileged characters," he replied. They were poor Kazan, like the author evidently felt that this being so they might also be de-

generate a curious line of reasoning for anyone familiar with life in Hollywood.

Family Theater Preparing Thanksgiving TV Program

"That I May See," a special one-hour Thanksgiving television program presented by Family Theater and starring many of Hollywood's foremost players, has been scheduled for immediate filming. It was announced today by Father Patrick Peyton, CSC, founder of the Family Rosary Crusade.
