David Vincent Sheehan, formerly of Elmira, and now a writer, has had his latest literary effort, "Girl in the Hat," printed in the November issue of "Good Housekeeping Magazine," now on the

stand. It is considered his most important publication to date. His past writings have appeared in "America," the November issue of "Extension," and "The Sign," the magazine and the January issue of "Esquire."

Sheehan has been in the literature field since retiring from business because of ill health in November, 1949. He had been with his father in the firm of Sheehan's in Elmira since gradu-

ation from Holy Cross College in 1937.

BORN IN Elmira, the son of Mrs. Daniel and the late Daniel Sheehan, he was graduated from St. Mary's School, Elmira and from LaSalle Military Academy, Long Island.

At Holy Cross College he majored in philosophy and became interested in writing while at the Jesuit college at Worcester, Mass. He was editor of the "Purple Patcher," a publication devoted to the literary efforts of the students.

After a brief rest following his retirement he again took up writing and is also now associated with the Syracuse office of the OPS.
