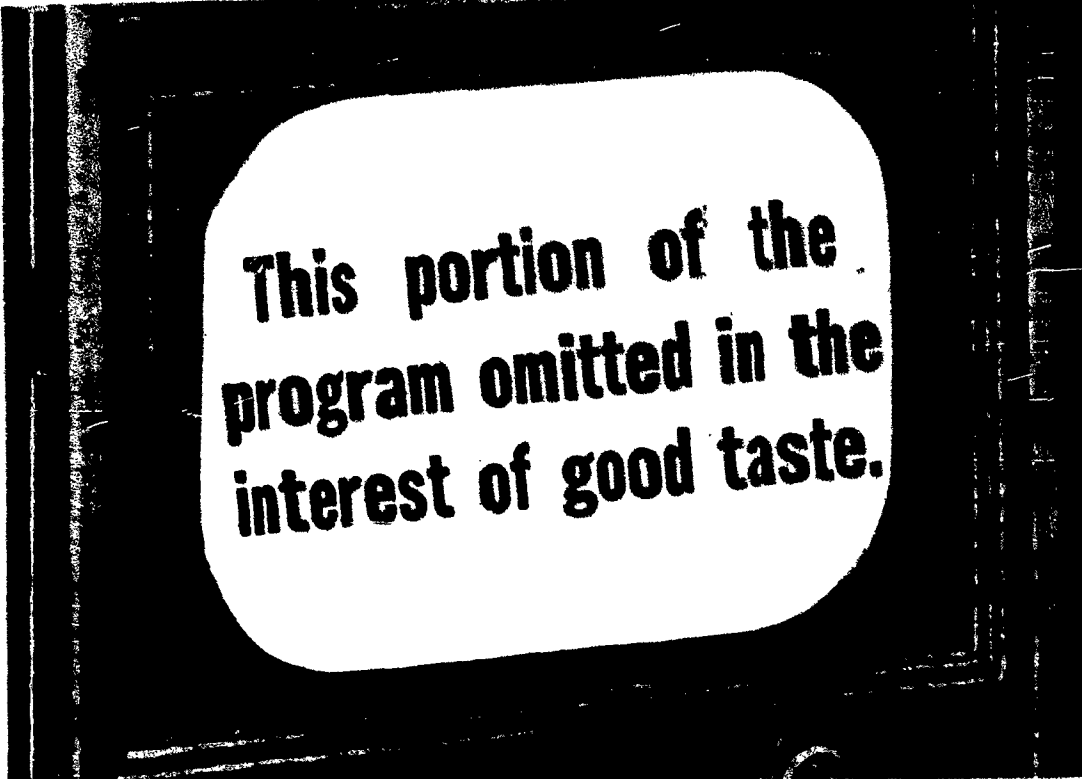
### Guide Students

### TV Station Commended For Respecting Decency

Detroit (Special) — "The Michigan Catholic" newspaper of the Archdiocese of Detroit, this week presented an editorial bouquet to Mr. Harry Bannister, general manager of the Detroit News' television and radio stations, WWJ-TV and WWJ. The editorial, according to The Michigan Catholic, was for these good deeds: "Last Thursday night, Oct. 25, WWJ-TV aired the sound portion of the Standard Oil Co.'s Wayne King show when a singer came out with a bearing lyric of the song 'Sweet Violets.' Again, Saturday night on the Lucky Strike Hit Parade show, WWJ-TV aired a similar, low-taste variation of 'I Get Ideas.' Sunday night again, WWJ-TV edited 'I Get Ideas' from the Eddie Cantor show. Each time WWJ-TV flashed a slide which explained:

"This portion of the program omitted in the interest of good taste."  
"THUS MR. BANNISTER and WWJ-TV practice what they profess. Recently they subscribed with other telecasters to a code of ethics and decency and good taste for programs they purvey to our living rooms. Presumably the national networks also subscribed to that code, but apparently the policy hasn't percolated down from their top brass to their program producers."

### Parting - Sweet Sorrow

In a frequently quoted line Shakespeare has Romeo whisper, "Partings are such sweet sorrow." Lacking the Bard's genius we borrow and paraphrase, "Anniversaries and retirements are such sweet sorrow." Within the past few weeks I have participated in, or witnessed several such occasions which because of their wide interest merit space in this column. Early in October I was present at the retirement of Miss Isabel T. Goss as president of the Guild of Mercy Hospital, an office which she capably filled for twenty-five years. A silver jubilee in 1951 means that the president took office in a year that of that decade described as the Roaring Twenties, followed by what many of us can remember as the Terrible Thirties when institutions and organizations, like individuals, had a terrible time making ends meet.

### Hollywood In Focus

#### Anyone Can Make a Movie — But One Need Not See It

Gary Cooper was an Academy "Oscar" for his heroic "Sergeant York" and established himself as a solid American icon when he went to Washington as an anti-Communist witness before the Un-American Activities Committee. Yet his name never created a greater stir in Hollywood than when, last week, he was reported to be in a new film enterprise with Carl Foreman, "uncooperative witness" at the recent Hollywood investigations.

Foreman had just been bought out of the Stanley Kramer production company for whom he wrote such screenplays as "Champion" and "Home of the Brave." Kramer made his bones about it. He was "in complete disagreement" with Carl Foreman over his stand before the Un-American Activities Committee. Foreman had testified that he was not then a Communist; that he had not been a Communist a year earlier, but for reasons best known to himself, refused to answer the simple question, "Were you ever a member of the Communist Party?"

Any man who chooses to take up this attitude has only himself to blame for the consequences. THE MOTION Picture Industry Council, which embodies all the major Hollywood trade and professional organizations, had gone on record "having no sympathy with witnesses who sided on the First and Fifth Amendments; who refuse to give their complete repudiation of Communism and demonstrate their loyalty to our country." Foreman must have known this. Still he chose not to answer under oath.

The Hollywood movie industry has since shown that "uncooperative witnesses" like known Communists, are no longer to be given employment in American films unless and until they clear themselves of all suspicion and doubt.

Aside, however, from the merits of Carl Foreman's case, the fact that Gary Cooper's name was put forward as an associate with Foreman in a film production enterprise and that Lippert Productions, Inc. was to distribute the resultant film, tended to change the whole climate of Hollywood opinion as to the value and meaning of attitudes taken by certain movie people during the recent investigations and policies to be followed in dealing with them. That became the real issue at stake. A dangerous gap in Hollywood's new defenses against Communist infiltration was threatening.

Neither Robert Lippert, nor his associate MURRAY LERNER (also associated with the Lerner Shops) had any comment to make when I called them. I. H. Prinzmetal, attorney and business manager for Gary Cooper, told me, however, that there is not and has not been any legal contract between Carl Foreman and Gary Cooper to form this company; that the matter was discussed between them and that Cooper may have been disposed to invest something in the proposed Carl Foreman Productions, Inc. but that as I write, "Gary Cooper is not involved, nor will he become involved."
