Armistice Day Mass Set At Old St. Mary's Sunday

Opening the annual American Legion Armistice Day Ceremonies, a Solemn High Mass will be celebrated in old St. Mary's Church, Washington Park, on Sunday, Nov. 11.

The Mass to be celebrated by the Rev. Elmer W. Heindl, a Legion county chaplain, will be at the recently dedicated altar built in memory of the late Rev. Dr. George F. Kertell, former pastor of old St. Mary's and a Past National Chaplain of the American Legion.

FATHER HEINDL will be assisted by other former service chaplains. The memorial services are being held in St. Mary's on the invitation of the Very Rev. Msgr. James C. McAniff, pastor.

The sermon will be preached by the Rev. Paul Cudde, of St. Andrew's Seminary faculty and a former U. S. Army Air Force Chaplain.

The Mass will be served by four uniformed Legionnaires. Music will be furnished by the Women's Choral Club of Rochester, assisted by the Choir of St. Mary's Church accompanied by Jerry Vogt at the organ.

Members of *Voiture III* of the Forty and Eight will act as ushers and the *Gold Star Mothers* of Monroe County are to be guests of honor.

EACH MOTHER will be greeted at the Church by a committee of Auxiliary members under the direction of Mrs. Ann Starr, county auxiliary chairman. Each *Gold Star Mother* will be presented with a carnation in memory of her son who made the supreme sacrifice.

Officers and members of other Veteran organizations in Monroe County as well as every Legionnaire in the county have been invited.

Following the church services, the Memorial Ceremonies at the Plaque adjacent to the Rundel Memorial Library, will be held. Taps will be sounded on Monday, Nov. 12 at 11 a.m. at each main intersection of Main Street from Bull's Head to Main St. East and Goodman.
