50 Friends of Trappists Organize To Help Monks

First steps in the organization of the Trappist Friends Guild to aid the Cistercian monks at Our Lady of the Genevieve Monastery, Piffard, were undertaken by approximately 50 friends of the monks at St. Joseph's House of Hospitality.

Further steps will be taken at the next meeting of the group, scheduled Thursday, Nov. 29, at the Hospitality House.

SPEAKER WAS the Rev. Joseph A. Cirincione, pastor of St. Francis of Assisi Church who described the final days in the life of Frater M. Dennis Mayer, 77-year-old monk who died Sept. 25 in St. Mary's Hospital, Rochester first to die of the most.

All necessary winter clothing for the Trappists at Piffard was provided this week, at a cost of \$300. Anyone wishing to donate toward this expense is welcome to do so.

When someone presented Frater Cirincione with a small sum of money toward clothing for the 30 monks, it gave the priest an idea.

He visited a surplus goods store and made all the needed purchases. Persons desiring to contribute toward the \$300 cost may do so by mailing checks to the Rev. Joseph A. Cirincione at 77 Whitney St., Rochester 11, N. Y.

More than 30 monks who came to Rochester Diocese early this year to establish the monastery near Geneva.

Discussion of the immediate needs of the Trappists, who now are living in an overcrowded farmhouse while struggling to erect four new buildings on the river fronting property, was the principal business of the meeting. A temporary ways and means committee was named to plan meetings of the group pending election of permanent officers, which will be deferred until some time after the first of the year.

Plans for formation of similar guilds in Buffalo and Syracuse were considered. An inquiry at that time has been received from a Buffalo business firm anxious to set up an organization.

Aquinas Magazine Drive Tops Nation With \$70,550

Chalk up another victory for Aquinas Institute. The Dewey Ave. School which is noted for its scholastic and athletic proficiency has added another laurel to its many "firsts" of the nation.
