Organized For Worker-Priests

ROME - (RNS) - A special seminary for the education of so-called worker-priests has been organized in the Bologna Roman Catholic Arch-diocese with the official approval of His Eminence Giovanni Battista Cardinal Naselli-Rocca, Archbishop of Bologna.

The seminary will be conducted by the National Institute for Religious and Moral Assistance to Workers. This group is made up of priests who carry on a spiritual apostolate among workers in the same manner as do those belonging to the well-known Mission de Paris in France.

Cardinal Naselli-Rocca announced in a decree that the new seminary would receive pupils from other Italian dioceses as well as from Bologna. It will be conducted along the lines of regular diocesan seminaries, but will provide special courses in sociology, political economy, sociology and other subjects.

Civilian Typists Wanted For Navy

Typists and stenographers are urgently needed for civilian assignments in Navy Headquarters Offices in Washington, D. C. Two Navy Civilian Representatives are now in Rochester for a limited time only to interview and test applicants from this area.

Applicants must be able to type 40 words per minute to be appointed to a typing position and be able to take dictation at 80 words per minute to qualify for a stenographic position.

Navy Civilian employees earn 20 days of vacation leave a year, 15 days sick leave and annual automatic salary increases. Salaries for these positions start at \$2800 per year. Applicants must be at least 18 years of age.

The Navy will reserve a room for the first 7 days in Washington and will assist appointees in securing permanent residence. There are non-profit government operated cafeterias in all Navy Buildings and 3 meals a day may be purchased there at reasonable cost. Applicants interested in these Navy positions should contact the Navy Civilian Representatives at the U. S. Navy Recruiting Station, Federal Building, Rochester, N. Y.
