Cardinal Mooney's 25 Years In Episcopate To Be Observed

Solemn dedication of Detroit's Cathedral church of the Blessed Sacrament on Sunday, Nov. 17 will also mark the 25th anniversary in the Episcopate of His Eminence Edward Cardinal Mooney who was fourth Bishop of the Diocese of Rochester.

In observance of the anniversary, His Excellency Bishop Kearney will attend the dedicatory ceremonies in Detroit. A delegation to include the Rt. Rev. Magr. William M. Hart, P. A. V. G. the Rt. Rev. Lawrence B. Casey who was Archbishop Mooney's secretary when Bishop of Rochester, the Very Rev. James C. McAniff and Rev. Dr. John E. Maney, Bishop Kearney's secretary, is planned for the Detroit observance.

Cardinal Mooney will preside at a Solemn Mass of Thanks giving that will climax the rites of consecration. To mark the Cardinal's silver jubilee, the priest and approximately one million lay Catholics of the archdiocese will present him with a great spiritual bouquet.

CONSECRATION of the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament will take place some four decades after the consecration of the structure was and the majestic design, composed of twin towers rising to the top of 15 feet, was completed in 1910. Many things, including the inscription of the year, 1910, have been retained.

In 1935, the first step up his duties as Archbishop of Detroit Cardinal Mooney designated Blessed Sacrament Church as the Cathedral and promised to complete the structure in a manner fitting to the rank. Several years ago the cathedral was commissioned architecturally to be a masterpiece of art and architecture.

Cardinal Mooney was appointed to his present position in August, 1948, after having served as Archbishop of St. Louis for 10 years. He is the first of his rank to have served in the position since the death of Cardinal Gibbons in 1895.

THE ARCHBISHOP was installed as Bishop of Detroit by His Eminence Cardinal Patrick Cardinal Hayes in 1935. Cardinal Hayes was succeeded by Cardinal Richard C. Gooden in 1948. Cardinal Gooden was succeeded by Cardinal John A. Mooney in 1948.

Prior to serving as Apostolic Delegate to Detroit to which he was named in Feb. 25, 1931, the present Cardinal Archbishop of Detroit was Apostolic Delegate

to India. The first American ever to receive such an honor and before that was spiritual director of the North American College in Rome.

MANIFESTING THE esteem in which Archbishop Mooney was held in this diocese more than 200 priests of the diocese held a testimonial for him in Hotel Seneca on July 29, 1937 with Monsignor Hart presenting the testimonial.
