

Charleston Newspaper Recalls:

Southern Confederacy Appointed Bishop To Vatican As Plenipotentiary Minister

ROME (NC)—In a time when the President of the United States is sending a representative to the Vatican, and the Catholic Bishop is appointing a representative to the Vatican, the News and Courier, a leading daily newspaper of this city, has reminded readers in a special article...

THE STORY says Bishop Lynch was conducting a retreat for the Sisters of Mercy at White Sulphur Springs, Va., when he received from Judah P. Benjamin, Secretary of State for the Confederacy, notification of his appointment as Minister Plenipotentiary of the Confederate States.

"DESPITE THIS, the Vatican did recognize the Confederacy to the extent of addressing a letter to Jefferson Davis, President of the Confederate States of America."

MEANWHILE, the paper also notes, President Abraham Lincoln had sent Archbishop John Joseph Hughes of New York to represent the Union side at the Vatican.

The Bishop accepted the commission with the understanding that he would not have to be absent from his diocese longer than six months, and could return at any time if his presence were required.

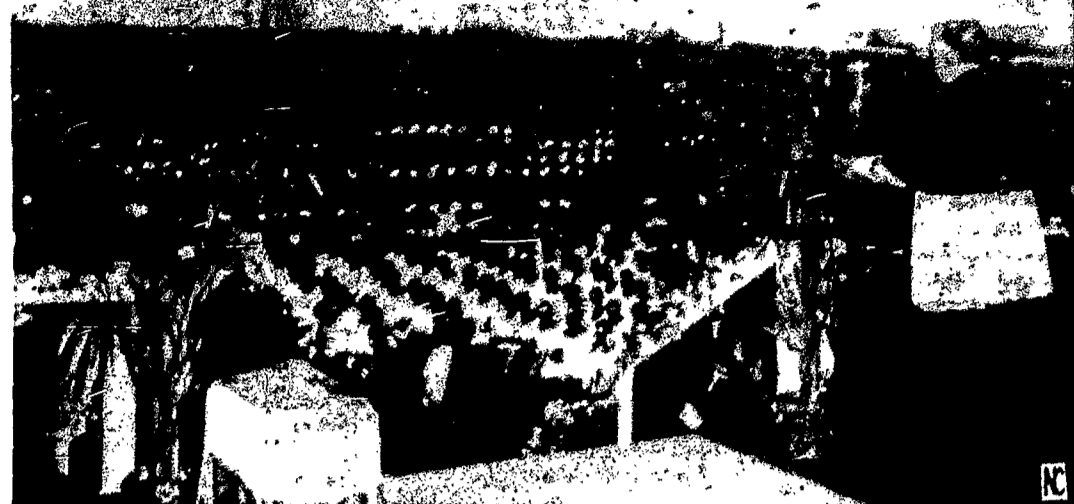
"Bishop Lynch had hopes of recognition of the Confederacy by France because of Napoleon III's ambitions in Mexico, but the Confederacy surrendered before this could take place."

"Bishop Lynch bore a commission from Jefferson Davis, President of the Confederate States of America," the paper says, "appointing him 'special commissioner of the Confederate States to the States of the Church'."

IN PARIS, Bishop Lynch was received by the Papal Nuncio and was granted an interview with Napoleon III. The French Emperor was reported to appear friendly to the Confederate cause, but to fear to act in recognition of the Confederacy unless England did the same, which was not forthcoming.

"UPON THE occasion of Bishop Lynch's visit to Rome, Cardinal Antonelli, the dominant factor in the papal government at that time, assured the American Ambassador, Mr. King, that the Bishop was received and recognized only as a Bishop on an official visit, and never recognized as a Minister Plenipotentiary."

Recite Rosary At Washington Monument Reds Ambush Pastor In Trieste Yugoslav Zone



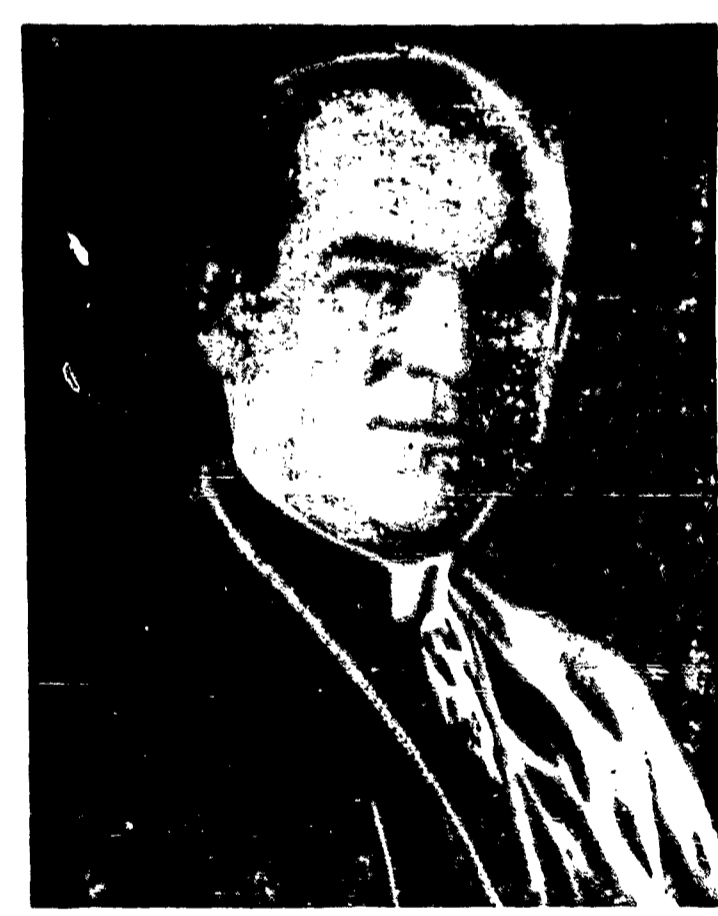
Participating in one of the greatest religious gatherings in the history of the national capital, some 70,000 persons knelt on the historic Washington monument ground and recited the Rosary.
