New York (NC)—Thirteen Missionary Sisters of Our Lady of Africa sailed from here as the first of two groups departing this month to take over missionary posts in Africa.

Because the nuns work in conjunction with the White Fathers in the African missions they are popularly known as the White Sisters. Ten of the group which departed took first vows on the Feast of Christ the King, October 28.

The White Sisters Convent at Metuchen, N. J., disclosed that a second group of three Sisters will leave for central Africa later in the month. The three are veterans in mission work. Each has spent from 20 to 30 years in African missions.
