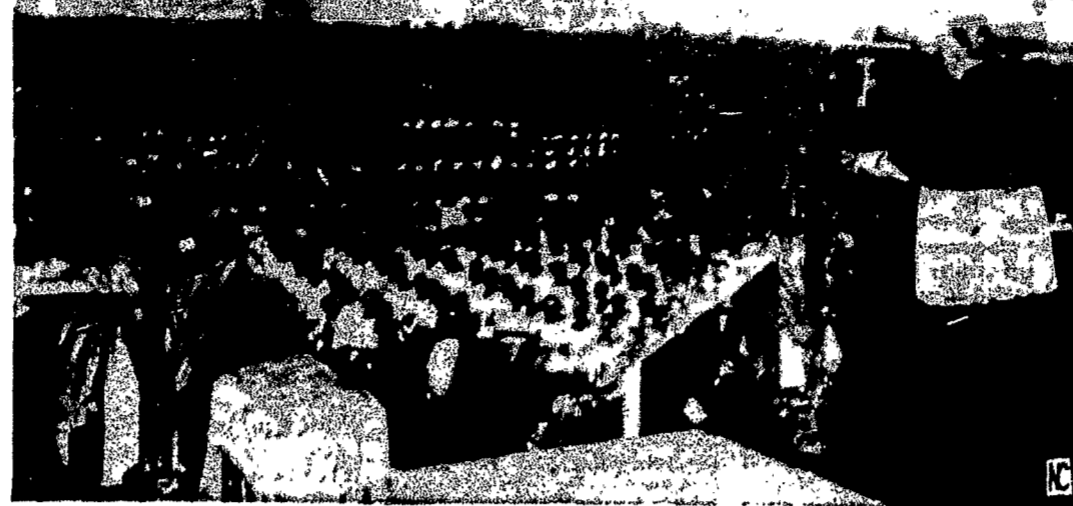

Recite Rosary At Washington Monument Reds Ambush Pastor In Trieste Yugoslav Zone



Participating in one of the greatest religious gatherings in the history of the national capital, some 75,000 persons knelt on the historic Washington monument ground and recited the Rosary, in ceremonies marking the Archdiocesan family Rosary crusade.

Rome — (AP) — The Catholic pastor of Capodistria, in the Yugoslav administered Zone B of the Free Territory of Trieste, was brutally beaten by a band of 20 young communists according to reports reaching here.

Mgr. Giorgio Bruni, who has been pastor at Capodistria for 30 years, was on his way to Capodistria, where he was to act as the delegate of Bishop Antonio Santin of Trieste at Confirmation ceremonies.

Halfway to the place where he was to officiate, Monsignor Bruni's automobile was stopped and he was dragged from it into nearby woods, beaten and kicked, and left dying. Found hours later, he was brought to a Trieste hospital, where it was found he had suffered a broken nose, fractures of several ribs on both sides, and multiple contusions. It was estimated he would be hospitalized for about two months.

Bishop Vincent Ryan Of Bismarck Dies

Bismarck, N. Dak. — (AP) — Funeral services for Bishop Vincent J. Ryan, of Bismarck, spiritual leader of 56,000 Catholics in western North Dakota were held here Nov. 15. Bishop Ryan died (on November 10) of acute heart failure brought on by a bad cold and excessive work, according to his physician. He was 67. He had entered the hospital two days before his death.

Baptists Oppose Parochial School Tax Exemption

Fresno, Cal. — (RNS) — Attempts to exempt California parochial schools from taxation were opposed by the Northern California Baptist Convention in a resolution adopted at its annual meeting here.

A legislative act passed early this year would have extended to primary and secondary schools the tax exemption already enjoyed by church, and other non-profit, colleges.

However, before the law could become effective a taxpayer group blocked it by obtaining the necessary number of signatures on a petition for a state-wide referendum. The referendum will go before the voters in the next general or special election.

Baptists Seek State Subsidies In Australia

Melbourne (RNS) — The annual assembly of the Baptist Union agreed here to a request by the denomination's Home Mission Committee that it be permitted to approach the government for financial subsidies.

Specifically, the committee will ask the Department of Health for government grants towards the erection of Baptist free kindergartens and operational expenses for them. It was pointed out that although building materials are under strict controls the government is allowing churches in new residential areas to erect free kindergartens and operate them under government subsidies.

3 More China Bishops Arrested; Total Now 20

Tokyo — (AP) — The arrest by the communists of three Franciscan Bishops — two of Italian and one of German nationality — has raised the number of imprisoned mission Ordinaries to 20. Six others are under house arrest and nine have been expelled.

The newly arrested prelates are: Archbishop Cyril Rudolf Jarro, O.F.M., of Tsinan, Shantung province. A native of Germany, the 73-year-old prelate was created a Bishop in 1929 and assumed his present post in 1946.

Bishop Ferruccio Costi, O.F.M. of Kichow, Hupeh province. Born in Italy in 1911, he became a Bishop in 1948.

Bishop Ferdinando Pulgenato, O.F.M., of Sanyuan, Chen si province. Born in Italy in 1897, he became a Bishop in 1944 and assumed his present post in 1946.
