Medical Supplies For Missionaries

Courier Article Inspires Aid To Medical Missions

Twelve Rochester women are supplying medicines and bandages for missions all over the world—and they credit their project to a column in the Catholic Courier Journal.

Known as the Medical Mission Group, or Blue Cross Circle, the women make dressings and bandages and solicit gifts of medicines which are sent to home and foreign missions.

The Rochester group became interested in helping the missions after reading Mrs. Mary L. Snyder's column in an August 1930 issue of the Courier Journal, in which she wrote of the work of the Auburn group. Under the auspices of Auburn Court, Catholic Daughters of America, a Medical Mission Group had been founded there 17 years before and is still active.

A MONTH AFTER reading the article, four women started a Rochester group which has grown now to 12 members. Although a group need meet only once a month, the Rochester women meet weekly in one of the members' homes.

Through the generosity of 35 area doctors who donate medicine "samples" which the women pick up themselves, the group is able to send out medicines otherwise unobtainable for many poor missions. In the last six months the group has packaged and sent out over 1,200 pounds. Only re-

cently a donation of penicillin and another of aureomycin was received.

Gauze is purchased locally with money each member donates regularly, and is made into small squares used in dressing sores. These are forwarded to the national headquarters in New York, the Medical Mission Board, where they are sterilized and sent to leper colonies in the Philippines, Africa and Asia.

FOUNDED by the Rev. Edward Garesche, S.J., in 1920, the National Board serves as a clearing house for information, medical aid and the distribution of supplies throughout the world. Aid is furnished particularly to the missions in the northwest, west and south of this country and outside of the country to China, India, Africa, Korea, Puerto Rico, Oceania, the Philippines and all other missionary sections of the world. The groups throughout the country have sent out immense quantities of medicines, instruments and equipment.

Besides the satisfaction gained from helping persons in great need, members of the medical
