Trinitarian Sisters Await New Motherhouse, Chapel

Sisters, Missionary Servants of the Most Blessed Trinity working in the Diocese of Rochester are enthusiastic over the prospects of completion of their much needed Chapel and Motherhouse, ground for which was broken in Philadelphia on Nov. 18.

Philadelphia, Sisters here have been informed.

Blessing the ground for the building was the Very Rev. Thomas O'Keefe, custodian general of the Missionary Servants of the Most Holy Trinity, companion community to the Sisters. Both communities were founded by the Very Rev. Thomas A. Judge, C.M. in whose memory the Sisters' Chapel is being erected.

PLANS PROVIDE for a building in the form of a cross with the Father Judge Memorial Chapel given prominence at the front and forming one of the arms. A public entrance will face Solly Street and will accommodate approximately 400 persons. Built of brick and limestone trim the structure will be entirely fireproof and of permanent and durable materials to eliminate expensive maintenance.

The Trinitarian Sisters as they are better known came to the Diocese of Rochester on the request of the Rev. Dr. Joseph H. Getell in 1929.

The Sisters have three Cenacles in this diocese and work in several parishes. The Cenacles are: Christ the King Missionary Cenacle, 82 Prince St. serving Annunciation, Mt. Carmel, Holy Rosary and St. Patrick's parishes, Rochester; Blessed Trinity Missionary Cenacle, Lyons; and Blessed Trinity Missionary Cenacle, Auburn.

THE SISTERS assist the priests with religious instruction classes for children from the public schools on weekdays and with Sunday School in some parishes. They conduct Religion Vacation Schools during the summer months.

The Trinitarians constantly visit homes to urge attendance at Mass, Confession and Sunday School and seek to keep an up-to-date record in the parishes where the Sisters work.

These missionary Sisters depend upon the assistance of devout and zealous lay people whom they organize into apostolic groups and train for the remedial work so necessary to prevent further falling away especially by the children.

From their organization the Sisters' work has been to bring the faith to the child where faith and morals are in peril.

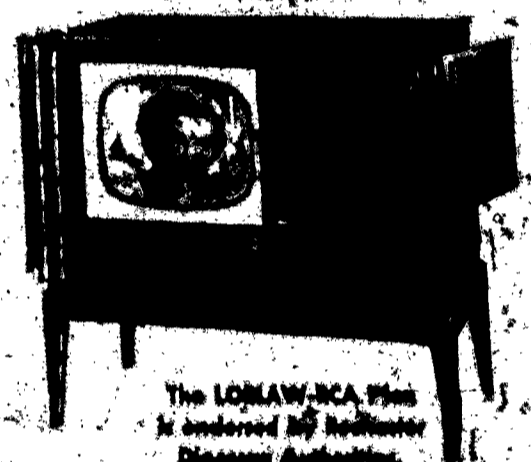
