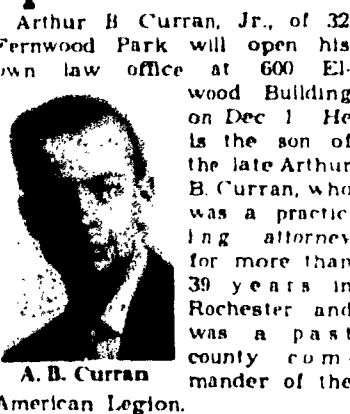
St. James Society Adds Christmas Fete
